REPORT OF THE RESEARCH METHODOLOGY COURSE IN SOCIAL SCIENCES

The ICSSR sponsored Research Methodology Course in Social Sciences was held from 24.11.2018 to 3.12.2018 in the Department of Economics. There were 30 Participants, out of which 12 were from the Economics Discipline, 01 from Political Science, 03 from Psychology, 01 from Anthropology, 01 from Diaspora studies, 01 from communication, 03 from management, 01 from commerce, 02 from Home Science, 01 from Women studies, 01 from law, 01 from geography, 01 from Tourism and 01 from education Department. The participants came from all over the places from India like Tamil Nadu, Chandigarh, Bihar, Patiala, Gwalior, Delhi, Roorkee, Gujarat, Hyderabad, Murthal, Rewari, Lucknow, Aligarh, Rohtak etc. Out of the 30 participants 20 were from outside Kurukshetra and 10 were from various departments of Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra.

In the Inaugural Session, the Course Director explained the relevance of the course for the research enrichment of the future researchers. Subject: Organization of the ICSSR Sponsored Two-Day National Seminar on "Decoding Mahatma Phule: Man, Reformer and Thinker" on 11-12 April 2018 by the Department – Report of the Seminar

The Department of History organized an ICSSR Sponsored Two-Day National Seminar on "Decoding Mahatma Phule: Man, Reformer and Thinker" under the aegis of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Chair on 11-12 April 2018 in the Faculty Lounge of the University. Prior to that, the proposal regarding organization of this Seminar was discussed in the Staff Council of the Department and the undersigned was authorized to take necessary action to this effect. The importance of the great contributions of Mahatma Phule for the country could hardly be over emphasized and we thought that it was highly imperative that we should devote serious attention to the life, works and thoughts of the great reformer. Hence, this proposal for the Seminar was submitted before the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) New Delhi for financial approval. In response to the proposal of the Department, the ICSSR vide its Letter No. F. No.C2/71/NS/2017-18/SC dated 27.12.2017 sanctioned an amount of Rs. 1,50,000 for organization of the above mentioned Seminar. The first instalment of Rs. 1,35,000 was also released vide the Canara Bank Cheque No. 245953 dated 30.12.2017 and the remaining amount of Rs. 15,000/- was to be released after the completion of the Seminar. Accordingly, the Department purposed to organize this National Seminar under the aegis of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Chair on 11-12 April 2018 on the occasion of Mahatma Phule Jayanti.

The proposed Seminar was designed in order to imbibe knowledge among students, research scholars and young faculty members about the life, works and thoughts of Mahatma Phule. It was also thought that the Seminar would also enable the participants that in what way the conventional and new sources on the subject could be utilized. In this Seminar, eminent Social Scientists, Historians and Scholars from different parts of India participated as Guests of Honor, Keynote Speakers, Chairpersons of the Technical Sessions, Delegates and Resource Persons and made a serious attempt to add one more chapter to the studies and research on the contributions of Mahatma Jyotiba/Jotirao Phule as a man, reformer and thinker to the humanity. The Seminar was structured as an intensive mix of lectures and

The Inaugural Session of the Seminar was held on 11 April 2018 at 10.30 a.m. with the singing of 'Buddha Vandana' by Dr. Ajit Singh Chahal, Assistant Professor, Department of Law, KUK. The Session was presided over by **Prof. Kailash Chandra Sharma, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor**, K.U. Kurukshetra. Our esteemed Chief Guest was Prof. T K Mathur, Former Dean Social Sciences & Head, Department of History, M D S University, Ajmer. At the outset, Dr. Vijender Singh, Organizing Secretary, formally welcomed the guests, delegates, participants, media persons and other invitees. The concept, theme and significance of the Seminar was presented by Prof. S. K. Chahal, Chairman & Professor-in-Charge of the Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Chair and Convener of the Seminar. 

In addition to the resource delegates and participants, the Seminar was also attended by many faculty members of the University, non-teaching employees, students, social activists, media persons and some prominent citizens of the city. In both of the days, the Seminar Hall of the Faculty Lounge was full with audience. ABOUT KURUKSHETRA:

Kurukshetra is a historical city in the state of Haryana, India. It is also known as Dharmakshetra ("Holy Place") or the "Land of Bhagwad Gita". Kurukshetra lies at a distance of about 160 kms from Delhi and about 85 kms from Chandigarh being the nearest airport. Kurukshetra is well connected by road/rail from various places of the country. The importance of the place is attributed to the fact that War of the Mahabharata was fought on this land and the Bhagavad Gita was preached here (Jyotisar) during the war when Lord Krishna found Arjuna in a terrible dilemma, Lord Krishna gave sermon to Arjuna that is known as Bhagavad Gita. The weather of Kurukshetra during the month of February remains about 10-22 degree Celsius.

**National Workshop on
Gender Equity in Science and Technology for Sustainable Development
Feb. 21, 2019**

संयुक्त राष्ट्र ने 22 दिसम्बर 2015 के अपने घोषणा पत्र के माध्यम से प्रतिवर्ष 11 फरवरी को 'विज्ञान में महिला एवं बालिका अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय दिवस' के रूप में मनाने की घोषणा की। इस दिवस को मनाने का मुख्य उद्देश्य विज्ञान में बालिकाओं तथा महिलाओं के निम्न प्रतिनिधित्व को ध्यान में रखते हुए उन्हें पूर्ण भागीदारी के लिए प्रोत्साहित करना है ताकि इस क्षेत्र में उत्पन्न लैंगिक अंतर को दूर करने में मदद मिल सके। विश्व के लगभग सभी देशों में यह देखा गया है कि विभिन्न ऋद्धिवादी तथा सामाजिक-सांस्कृतिक अवरोध बालिकाओं को विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में करियर की शुरुआत करने तथा उसमें आगे बढ़ कर पूर्ण भागीदारी करने से रोकते हैं। इस कारण वैज्ञानिक शोध तथा विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में उच्च निर्णय निर्माण के पदा तक अत्यंत कम संख्या में महिलाएं पहुंच पाती हैं। अतः बालिकाओं में विज्ञान के प्रति रुचि जागृत करने, विज्ञान में शोध तथा प्रत्येक स्तर पर भागीदारी के लिए समान अवसर प्रदान करने की आवश्यकता महसूस करते हुए संयुक्त राष्ट्र ने यह घोषणा की।

महिला अध्ययन शोध केन्द्र, कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय तथा विज्ञान भारती, हरियाणा ने संयुक्त राष्ट्र के इन प्रयासों का हिस्सा बनने तथा उन्हें आगे बढ़ाने हेतु विश्वविद्यालय के विभिन्न विज्ञान तथा प्रौद्योगिकी विभागों तथा कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय से संबंधित महाविद्यालयों के महिला शोधार्थियों तथा प्राध्यापकों हेतु 21 फरवरी 2019 को एक द्विविधायी राष्ट्रीय सम्मेलन 'सतत विकास हेतु विज्ञान तथा प्रौद्योगिकी में लैंगिक सहभागिता' का आयोजन किया। इस सम्मेलन का मुख्य उद्देश्य विज्ञान तथा प्रौद्योगिकी के क्षेत्र में शोध को बढ़ावा देना था। इस क्षेत्र में महिलाओं के नेतृत्व के पदों को प्राप्त करने हेतु प्रेरित करना व उनके आत्म विश्वास में वृद्धि करना था। इस कार्यक्रम में लगभग 150 प्रतिभागियों ने भाग लिया। पिछले वर्ष फरवरी 2018 में भी केन्द्र तथा विज्ञान भारती, हरियाणा ने दो दिवसीय कार्यक्रम 'विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में महिलाओं की महत्वकांक्षाएँ' का आयोजन किया गया था और इसी श्रृंखला को आगे बढ़ाते हुए आगामी वर्षों में भी इसी प्रकार के कार्यक्रम आयोजित किये जाते रहेंगे।

कार्यक्रम का प्रारम्भ महिला अध्ययन शोध केन्द्र की निदेशिका प्रो० रंजना अग्रवाल ने अपने स्वागत भाषण से किया। उन्होंने कहा कि प्राचीन भारतीय इतिहास को देखें तो अनेक महिलाओं ने विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में अपना योगदान किया है, बल्कि यह कहना अतिव्योचित नहीं होगी कि हर महिला ही वैज्ञानिक है जो अध्यात्मिक, प्राकृतिक विज्ञान तथा चिकित्सा पद्धति का उपयोग अपने जीवन में कहीं न कहीं करती हैं। उन्होंने कहा कि आज वैश्विक स्तर पर महिलाओं की विज्ञान तथा प्रौद्योगिकी में भागीदारी सुनिश्चित करने के लिए प्रयास किये जा रहे हैं ताकि उनको भी मुख्यधारा में शामिल करके विज्ञान में लैंगिक समानता को सुनिश्चित किया जा सके।

सम्मेलन के उद्घाटन सत्र में अध्यक्षीय उद्बोधन देते हुए कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय के माननीय कुलपति प्रो० कैलाश चन्द्र शर्मा ने कहा कि विकास में महिला तथा पुरुष दोनों की बराबरी की भागीदारी होनी चाहिए। हालांकि महिलाएं हर क्षेत्र में आगे बढ़ रही हैं तथा वे विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में भी अभूतपूर्व योगदान दे रही हैं। परन्तु यदि हम इन महिलाओं की संख्या पर नजर डालें तो यह बहुत ही नगण्य है। आज के समाज में यह सोच व्याप्त है कि महिलाओं की शिक्षा की प्राथमिकता दूसरे दर्जे पर है। इस प्रकार की सोच को संस्कृति नहीं कहा जा सकता। यह अपसंस्कृति है। महिलाओं के प्रति यह सोच हमारी मानसिक वृत्ति के कारण है। महिलाएं किसी भी दृष्टि से कम नहीं हैं। वे आर्थिक तथा उत्पादक विकास में समान रूप से अपना योगदान दे सकती हैं। हम सभी को गंभीरता से यह प्रयास करना होगा कि महिलाओं व लड़कियों को भी हर प्रकार की स्वतंत्रता दें। साथ ही समाज की पाषण्ड वृत्तियों से स्वयं को बचाने के लिए सक्षम करना होगा। इस काम को समाज के सभी वर्गों को मिलकर करना होगा।

उद्घाटन सत्र में मुख्यअतिथि, फोरम फार अवेयरनेस ऑफ नेशनल सिविलिटी के प्रमुख संरक्षक तथा सुप्रसिद्ध समाज सुधारक श्री इंद्रेश कुमार जी ने कहा कि भारत विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में विश्व गुरु रहा है। आज जहां नासा चांद्र सितारों पर पहुंचने की बात कर रहा है हमारे भारतीय ज्ञान में सब कुछ पहले से ही अंकित है। हमने विज्ञान के सही अर्थ तथा उसके सदुपयोग को ठीक से नहीं समझा। आज विज्ञान, तकनीक तथा ज्ञान में भ्रष्टाचार के कारण ही विज्ञान वरदान न होकर अभिषाप बन गया है। भारतीय संस्कृति में हमेशा से ही महिलाओं का उच्च स्थान रहा है। परन्तु आज जेंडर शब्द अन्तर्द्वन्द्व पैदा कर रहा है। एक माँ की कोख से ही सारे वैज्ञानिक तथा महापुरुष पैदा हुए हैं फिर आज बेटों को बोज़ वयों माना जा रहा है। उन्होंने आगे कहा कि यह अर्तद्वन्द्व हमारे मस्तिष्क तथा दिलों में है विज्ञान की दृष्टि से हमें इस सत्य को स्वीकार करना होगा। उन्होंने अंत में कहा कि महिला ही संस्कृति है तथा संस्कृति ही महिला है तथा हमें महिलाओं के योगदान को समझना पड़ेगा तभी सारी समस्याओं का समाधान हो पायेगा।

कार्यक्रम की विषिष्ट अतिथि विटस पिलानी, हैदराबाद कैम्पस की अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय कार्यक्रम एवं सहयोग अधिष्ठाता प्रो० सुमन कपूर ने अपने वक्तव्य में कहा कि सांस्कृतिक पक्षपात तथा अवचेतन मन के पक्षपात महिलाओं को आगे बढ़ने से रोकते हैं। प्रकृति महिला-पुरुष में कोई भेदभाव नहीं करती। यहाँ तक कि जब गर्भ में पितृ का विकास

होता है तब भी नारीत्व तथा पुरुषत्व साथ-साथ विकसित होते हैं। तीन महीने के गर्भ के बाद यह सुनिश्चित होता है कि बच्चा लम्बा होगा या लडका होगा। उन्होंने आगे कहा कि आज निर्णय लेने के पदों पर बहुत ही कम महिलायें पहुँच पाती हैं, इसका कारण यह नहीं है कि महिलाओं की क्षमताओं में कमी है बल्कि इसका कारण हमारी अवधारणाएँ हैं जो कि महिलाओं को आगे बढ़ने से रोकती हैं। उद्घाटन सत्र के अन्त में विज्ञान भारती, हरियाणा के सचिव प्रो० ज्ञान प्रकाश दुबे ने धन्यवाद भाषण दिया।

उद्घाटन सत्र के पश्चात दो तकनीकी सत्रों का आयोजन किया गया। पहले सत्र में प्रो० सुमन कपूर ने टर्निंग टेक्नोलॉजी इन दू टूल्स पर , गुरु जम्शेधर विश्वविद्यालय, हिसार के भौतिक विज्ञान से प्रो० सुनिता श्रीवास्तव ने भारत की प्रेरणादायक महिला वैज्ञानिकों पर व्याख्यान दिया। प्रो० आर.एम.पी. जायसवाल ने विज्ञान भारती को योगदान की चर्चा की। दूसरे तकनीकी सत्र में आयुष्मान हस्पताल, दिल्ली की मुख्य डायरेक्ट्रिस प्रो० विनती डावर ने स्वास्थ्य तथा पोषण : लैंगिक परिप्रेक्ष्य पर तथा एन.आई.टी. कुरुक्षेत्र से प्रो० नीना जर्गी ने विज्ञान तथा प्रौद्योगिकी में लैंगिक भेदभाव : समाधान तथा नीतियों पर चर्चा की।

**National Workshop on
Empowering Women through Legal Awareness
March 28-29, 2019**

महिला अध्ययन शोध केन्द्र, कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा 28-29 मार्च 2019 को आई.सी.एस.एस.आर. उत्तर-पश्चिम क्षेत्रीय केन्द्र, चंडीगढ़ के सहयोग से दो दिवसीय कानूनी जागरूकता कार्यशाला 'कानूनी जागरूकता द्वारा महिला सशक्तिकरण' का आयोजन किया गया। इस कार्यशाला में हरियाणा पंजाब, हिमाचल प्रदेश तथा चंडीगढ़ के विभिन्न विश्वविद्यालयों तथा महाविद्यालयों के लगभग 60 महिला प्राध्यापकों तथा शोधार्थियों ने भाग लिया। इस कार्यशाला के माध्यम से प्रतिभागियों को महिलाओं से संबंधित विभिन्न मूलभूत कानूनी अधिकारों तथा प्रावधानों की जानकारी दी गई ताकि वे जीवन में आने वाली विभिन्न चुनौतियों का सामना कुशलता तथा आत्मविश्वास के साथ कर सकें। इस कार्यशाला के माध्यम से प्रतिभागियों को न्याय प्रदान करने वाली एजेंसियों जैसे पुलिस तथा न्यायिक व्यवस्था के बारे में भी जानकारी दी गई जिससे वे सही समय पर अपने तथा दूसरों के अधिकारों की रक्षा कर सकें।

कार्यशाला के उद्घाटन सत्र में केन्द्र की निदेशिका प्रो० रंजना अग्रवाल ने कार्यशाला का उद्देश्य बताते हुए कहा कि महिला सशक्तिकरण के लिए कानूनी जानकारी उपलब्ध होना अत्यन्त आवश्यक है। उन्होंने कहा कि इस कार्यशाला के माध्यम से महिलाओं को अपनी स्थिति को बेहतर बनाने में मदद मिलेगी।

कुरुक्षेत्र की पुलिस उपाधीक्षक सुश्री तान्या सिंह ने कहा कि हम एक ऐसे समाज में रह रहे हैं जहां हम अपने कर्तव्यों की बजाय अपने अधिकारों को ज्यादा महत्व देते हैं। पुलिस को तभी दिक्कतों का सामना करना पड़ता है जब हम अपने कर्तव्यों को छोड़कर हर समस्या के समाधान के लिए पुलिस पर निर्भर हो जाते हैं। महिलाओं के प्रति अपराधों में पुलिस को 99 प्रतिशत केंसों में सफलता मिलती है परन्तु एक बात यह भी सच है कि झूठे केंसों की संख्या भी काफी बढ़ गई है। उन्होंने कहा कि केंसों पर कार्यवाही करते समय दोनों पक्षों को सुनना जरूरी होता है क्योंकि परिवार, समाज तथा संस्कृति इतना दबाव बनाते हैं कि सही निर्णय लेना मुश्किल हो जाता है। उन्होंने कहा कि महिलाएं असमानता के लिए खुद ही जिम्मेवार हैं। हमें अपनी क्षमताओं को निखारना चाहिए तथा अपनी कमजोरियों को पहचान कर उन्हें दूर करने का प्रयास करना चाहिए। आगे उन्होंने कहा कि आज की महिलाएं पुरुषों से काफी आगे निकल गई हैं वे हर क्षेत्र में काम कर रही हैं परन्तु पुरुष सामाजिक दबाव के कारण घरेलू जिम्मेवारियों से बचते हैं। आज पुरुषों को महिलाओं की बराबरी करने की जरूरत है। उन्होंने कहा कि समानता को आन्तरिक रूप से महसूस करें तथा दूसरों को भी समानता दें। उन्होंने सभी प्रतिभागियों से अपील की कि वे सचेत रहें तथा अपराध से बचने के तरीके अपनाएं क्योंकि पुलिस की भूमिका संरक्षणात्मक न होकर प्रतिक्रियात्मक है।

कार्यशाला के दूसरे दिन विधि संस्थान कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय के डा. अमित कुमार ने क्रिमिनल लॉ के अंतर्गत महिलाओं को प्राप्त संरक्षण की चर्चा की। विधि विभाग कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय से डा. प्रीती जैन ने महिलाओं के पुनरुत्पादक अधिकारों की चर्चा करते हुए कहा कि सरकार विभिन्न नीतियों के माध्यम से तथा संस्कृति विभिन्न मान्यताओं के माध्यम से महिलाओं के पुनरुत्पादन पर नियंत्रण करती है। जबकि मानवाधिकारों के अनुसार पुनरुत्पादन महिलाओं का अधिकार क्षेत्र है। अगले सत्र में विधि विभाग पंजाब विश्वविद्यालय की डा. सुपिंदर ने बाल न्याय कानून तथा पास्को कानून की बारीकियों को स्पष्ट किया।

अन्तिम सत्र में महिला अध्ययन शोध केन्द्र की पूर्व निदेशिका प्रो. ऋचा तंवर ने कार्यस्थल पर महिलाओं का लैंगिक शोषण अधिनियम की विस्तार से चर्चा की तथा विभिन्न उदाहरणों के माध्यम से लैंगिक शोषण की परिभाषा को स्पष्ट किया। उन्होंने कहा कि लैंगिक शोषण एक ऐसा विषय है जिसके प्रति पुरुष तो बड़ा स्वयं महिलाएं भी संवेदशील नहीं हैं। उन्होंने प्रतिभागियों को कहा कि वे इस विषय पर अपने महाविद्यालयों में गंभीरता से काम करें तथा लड़कियों को अन्याय से बचाएं।

प्रो० सुमन गुप्ता, विधि विभाग, कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय ने कहा कि लैंगिक समानता लाने के लिए कानून की जानकारी तो आवश्यक है ही साथ ही कानून की जानकारी दूसरों तक फैलाना भी जरूरी है। विवाह तथा तलाक के कानूनों का उल्लेख किया। हिन्दू विवाह अधिनियम के अन्तर्गत वैध विवाह की शर्तें तथा तलाक के विभिन्न आधारों का वर्णन किया। इसके अलावा उन्होंने मुस्लिम पर्सनल कानून के अन्तर्गत विवाह तथा तलाक के प्रावधानों को भी स्पष्ट किया।

पंजाब विश्वविद्यालय, चंडीगढ़ के विधि विभाग से प्रो. देविन्दर सिंह ने भारतीय संविधान में लैंगिक समानता तथा मानवाधिकार पर व्याख्यान दिया। उन्होंने कहा एक महिला बेटा, पत्नी तथा माँ के रूप में परिवार में ही असमानता की बिकार है, अतः कानून के द्वारा उनका संरक्षण आवश्यक है। संवैधानिक अधिकार सशक्तिकरण प्रदान करते हैं परन्तु उनकी जानकारी आवश्यक है।

पंजाब विश्वविद्यालय से डी. जॉ. मधुरिमा ने घरेलू हिंसा से महिलाओं का संरक्षण अधिनियम के अन्तर्गत बताये गये प्रावधानों की चर्चा की तथा विस्तार से घरेलू हिंसा का अर्थ स्पष्ट किया। दूसरे तकनीकी सत्र में विधि विभाग,

कुरुक्षेत्र विश्वविद्यालय के प्रो. अमित लूदरी ने पर्सनल कानूनों के तहत महिलाओं के सम्पत्ति के अधिकारों की जानकारी दी।




