# <u>Report of the Seven Days Special Camp</u> <u>on the theme 'Communal Harmony'</u> <u>Village Barna</u> <u>March 21-27, 2018</u>

National Service Scheme (NSS), University Teaching Departments, Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra, as one of its regular annual activities this session also organised a Seven Day Special Camp at Village Barna near the university from 21st March to 27th March, 2018. Taking into consideration, the rising intolerance in society and other recent unfortunate events witnessed in North India during some recent times 'Communal Harmony' was adopted as the theme of the camp. Most of the activities of the camp therefore concentrated around creating harmony and peace in the society. During the camp volunteers working on the motto of the NSS 'Not Me But You' spread the idea of communal harmony and popularized the digital India programs initiated by the government in the village and adjoining areas.

# Day 1 (21/03/2018) :-

On the first day of the camp, all the volunteers willing to participate in the camp assembled at Students' Home of the university. Dr. Neeraj Batish and Dr. raj Kamal, Programme Officers, highlighted the importance of the theme of the camp 'Communal Harmony' and the significance of the Seven Day Camp in the NSS. How the camp was to proceed in the next days was also discussed and the ideas and suggestions were invited from the volunteers to make it more involving and

result oriented. After that the volunteers got themselves formally registered for the camp and were divided into five different groups. The groups were named after various freedom fighters and were assigned different duties to be performed throughout the camp on rotational basis. After selecting their group leaders the volunteers left for Barna, in the university bus, where they were greeted with lunch

Shri. Shiv Lal, Sarpanch of the village was the Chief Guest at the inaugural on arrival. function of the camp which took place in the post lunch session in the Hira Lal Anganwari. The village sarpanch and the other eminent villagers present in the function during their interaction informed the volunteers about the different difficulties being faced by the villagers. The function ended with the singing of the National Anthem.

In evening the volunteers returned to the university campus and performed various night activities in the hostel which they were assigned. After dinner in the hostel the volunteers noted down their experience of the day in the camp which was to be a daily schedule and submitted at the completion of the camp.

#### Day 2 (22/03/2018) :-

The second day of the camp began at 6:30 a.m. with Yoga and Pranayam at the Community Centre of the university. Pankaj Rohilla, one of the participating volunteers from the Department of Physical Education and a qualified yoga instructor led the yoga activity every day during the camp. After practicing yoga for an hour the volunteers went back to their hostels for freshening up and breakfast. The volunteers again assembled at Students' Home at 9: 30 a.m. from where they were ferried to the village Barna.

The activities at the village began with the NSS Song followed by reading of the day before report by the group members who were assigned that duty. A digital awareness drive regarding the use and misuse of the applications being promoted by the government of India was carried out in the village through posters, playcards and practical mock demonstrations on the mobile handsets by the volunteers. Later on the same day a survey was also carried out by the volunteers regarding the impact of digitalization on the rural folks and specially the women. The survey showed that although digitalization had started making inroads into the lives of people yet a long way had to be gone before making it really successful.

Evening session of the camp witnessed experience sharing of the students from different faculties of the university regarding the relevance of the subjects taught to them and when actually put into practice. Gurbaksh and Yuvraj along with others took a lead in this. The volunteers after closing the day at village Barna with singing of National Anthem, the practice followed throughout the camp, returned to university. After having dinner the volunteers went into sharing their experience of the day with other residents of the hostels and acquainted them of the hardships being faced in the rural India.

# Day 3 (23/03/2018) :-

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The third day of the camp again started with yoga where Prof. D.S. Rana, Coordinator NSS Cell, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, paid a visit and highly appreciated the devotion and sentiment of social service being demonstrated by the volunteers and the Programme Officers.

It being Shahidi Diwas before leaving for Barna, the volunteers paid their respect and tribute at the statue of Shri. Bhagat Singh installed opposite university market. Dr. Neeraj Batish, Programme Officer, in a short address highlighted the

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role of freedom fighters and the sacrifices made by them because of which we now are able to enjoy a dignified and comfortable life.

The day at the village started with the usual practice of NSS Song and reading of the report which followed throughout the camp. First Aid and Home Nursing Training by the District Youth Red Cross was also initiated on the third day which was spread throughout the camp. In the afternoon session all the volunteers participated in slogan writing and poster making competition on the theme 'Communal Harmony.' Prof. D.S. Rana was the Chief Guest during the competition; he applauded and encouraged the volunteers with sharing of his healthy and rich experience. After that the routine schedule as reported earlier was practiced both at Barna and the university campus.

#### Day 4 (24/03/2018) :-

After practicing Yoga and daily morning schedule the volunteers reached Barna at 9:30 a.m. 'Duties of an NSS Volunteer and the Expectations of the Society' was the topic on which Dr. Neeraj Batish gave a detailed talk while Dr. Raj Kamal shared his views on 'Importance of Moral Values among Youth.' This was followed by a rally carried out by the volunteers on the theme 'Communal Harmony' in the village. After the rally the volunteers divided into various groups had an interaction with the villagers where they highlighted the importance of a peaceful and harmonious life. Communal Harmony stickers and badge were also distributed in the village.

Later Gurbaksh, Amit, Khushbu, Rashmi Battan, Abhishek, Naveen, Akhilesh, among others shared their views on the topics like Mutual Funds, Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, Water Harvesting, River Saraswati, Sustainable Development and the recent important judgments pronounced by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. These discussions were attended by many villagers as well. All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy. Hence a session for cultural activies was also kept for the day where Pankaj, Arvind, Rohit Pannu, Amit Sangwan showcased their talent.

#### <u>Day 5</u> (25/03/2018) :-

In addition to other activities three lectures fixed for the day were a source of excitement to the volunteers on the fifth day of the camp at village Barna. Prof. Tejinder Sahrma, Department of Commerce KUK and Former Coordinator NSS Cell, deliverd a spirited and motivational lecture. Discarding the use of polythene, maximum tree plantation and the motto of the NSS were the issues around which his lecture revolved. Prof. CDS Kaushal, Director, Youth and Cultural Affairs, KUK and a former Coordinator, NSS Cell, KUK and Indira Gandhi Awardee highlighted the role of the spirit of service in his address. He also expressed his concern on the decreasing use of Sanskrit in day to day life.

Prof. (Retd.) Himmat Singh Sinha, Department of Philosophy, KUK and an eminent speaker gave a rich talk on the importance of self-confidence and character building among youth.

#### Day 6 (26/03/2018) :-

A Blood Donation camp was organized at LNJP hospital Kurukshetra on the sixth day of the camp where twenty units of blood were donated by the volunteers. In the evening session Dr. Amit Kumar and Dr. Sant Lal, Institute of Law, Kurukshetra University addressed the students and shared their views on the topics 'Significance of Rights and Duties' and 'Role of Youth in Development' respectively. Both the addresses were highly appreciated by the volunteers.

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Ms. Harsha and Mr. Rohit Pannu, who had represented the UTD NSS at Republic Day Parade, Raj Path, New Delhi, shared their experiences and encouraged their other fellow volunteers to do put in maximum efforts in order to achieve that platform.

# Day 7 (27/03/2018) :-

The morning session of the last day of the camp again witnessed the interaction of the volunteers with the villagers. Communal Harmony stickers and badges were distributed throughout the village and a word of thankfulness and appreciation for being such a helpful host was spread. The volunteers appealed the villagers to sustain the spirit of communal harmony amongst them. The villagers too reciprocated with a very warm heart and extended the invitation for next time as well.

Shri Devi Dayal, Chairman, Block Samiti was the Chief Guest while Sri. Shiv Kumar, Sarpanch was the Guest of Honour at the Valedictory function which took place at 3:00 p.m. in the village anganwadi. The guests highly appreciated the gesture of the NSS volunteers and expressed hope in the bright future of India. The function included a host of patriotic cultural items which mesmerized the villagers. The Seven Day Special Camp concluded with singing of the NSS Song followed by National Anthem.




After this 4 leaders from each unit were selected according to their skills in different fields. Then different committees were allotted to them. These were:



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# About National Service Scheme (NSS)

### Overview

The Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports functioned under the overall guidance of the Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Youth Affairs & Sports during the year. In April, 2008, two separate Departments, namely, Department of Youth Affairs and Department of Sports, were created under the Ministry, each Department under the charge of a Secretary to the Government of India.

### **About Youth Department**

The Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports was initially set up as the Department of Sports in 1982 at the time of organization of the IX Asian Games in New Delhi . Its name was changed to the Department of Youth affairs & sports during celebration of the International Youth Year, 1985. It became a Ministry on 27th May,2000. Subsequently, the Ministry has been bifurcated in Deptt. of Youth Affairs and Deptt. of Sports under two separate Secretaries w.e.f. 30th April,2008. The specific subjects being dealt with by these two Departments are contained in the Order of the Govt. of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961.

The Youth, i.e. those falling within the age group of 15-29 years constitutes nearly 40% of the total population of India. This group which is the most vibrant and dynamic segment of the country's population constitutes potentially its most valuable human resource. To optimally tap their constructive and creative energies, the Department pursues the twin objectives of personality building and nation building, i.e. developing the personality of youth and involving them in various nation-building activities. As most of the issues concerning young people are the functions of other Ministries/Departments, like Education, Employment & Training, Health and Family Welfare, etc. the role of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports is to act as a facilitator and catalytic agent.

### National Service Scheme (NSS)

### **An Introduction**

In India, the idea of involving students in the task of national service dates back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the nation. The central theme which he tried to impress upon his student audience time and again, was that they should always keep before them, their social responsibility. The first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the service of those who provided the sinews of the nation with the national goods & services so essential to society. Advising them to form a living contact with the community in whose midst their institution is located, he suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do "something positive so that the life of the villagers might be raised to a higher material and moral level".

Started initially in 37 universities involving 40,000 volunteers, the scheme has grown over the years and it is implemented today with an involvement of more than 3.8 million volunteers spread over in 396 Universities, Polytechnics and 47 Councils of +2 level. The efforts of NSS volunteers have been widely acclaimed by the community, universities, colleges and general public as the NSS volunteers have been rendering selfless service to the community.

### Motto of NSS:

The Motto of NSS "**Not Me But You**", reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for self-less service. NSS helps the students development & appreciation to other person's point of view and also show consideration towards other living beings. The philosophy of the NSS is a good doctrine in this motto, which underlines on the belief that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of the society as a whole and therefore, the NSS volunteers shall strive for the well-being of the society.

### **NSS Logo:**

The logo for the NSS has been based on the giant Rath Wheel of the world famous Konark Sun Temple (The Black Pagoda) situated in Orissa, India. The Red & Blue colors contained in the logo motivate the NSS Volunteers to be active & energetic for the nation-building social activities. The wheel portrays the cycle of creation, preservation and release and signifies the movement in life across time and space, The wheel thus stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change.

The NSS logo is embossed on the badge of NSS. The eight bars in the wheel of NSS logo represent the 24 hours of a day. The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind.

### About Camp:

Under the directions of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Kailash Chandra Sharma and Dean Student Welfare Prof Pawan Sharma, a Seven Days "National Youth Awareness camp" was organize by NSS (UTD) from February 07-13<sup>th</sup>, 2020 in which the day activities were held at village Dayalpur and Morning & evening activities were held at KUK campus under the guidance and supervision of NSS programme Officers Dr. Surjeet Kumar, Dr. Sangeeta & Dr. Naresh Kumar. The details of activities (day wise) are presented below:

### Day 1 (07 February, 2020)

On February 07, 2020 NSS Seven Days Camp with the theme of Clean and Fit India was organised by Kurukshetra University under the supervision and support of Dr. Kailash Chandra Sharma and Dean Student Welfare Dr. Pawan Kumar Sharma at Dayalpur Village.

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers. After that NSS song was performed. This session continued for one hour.

At 9.30 am 185 NSS volunteers along with their 3 Program Officers went to Dayalpur where the Sarpanch Mr. Rajat Kumar interacted with the volunteers and gave esurance of full cooperation. Later Program Officers enlightened the volunteers regarding the theme and importance of seven days camp.

Then Swachtta Abhiyan took place in which all the volunteers participated with great enthusiasm. After this Program Officers went on inspection to check the work done by the volunteers.

Later different committees were allotted to volunteers. Such as- Operational Committee, Food Committee, Cultural Committee, Discipline Committee, Reporting Committee, Attendance Committee, Village Social Achiever and Photography- Media Committee.

Special lecture by Dr. Monika Malik, Associate Professor from Central University, Mahendragarh, delivered the lecture on the theme of discipline in life and importance of extracurricular activities in overall development.

After lunch, another special lecture was delivered by Dr. Ashok Kumar from Mass Communication, Kurukshetra University talked on the issue of Fake News in which he described the difference between fake and real news. He also talked about authentic and credible sources to gain information. And identification of fake images through these tools Google image search, Google reverse image search, time filters, most importantly Tineye and YouTube Data Viewer.

Then Discussion session took place in which volunteers opened up about importance of water conservation, importance of Anti-bullying etc also different problems in the societies with their remedies to overcome the problems were discussed and blueprint for the next day was created.

In the end Nukkad Natak was performed in the village by the volunteers on the theme of cleanliness and dedicated this play to street sweeper. The play was highly appreciated by the villagers.

#### Day 2 (08 February, 2020)

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held at university Auditorium Crush Hall, in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers. After that NSS song was performed. This session continued for one hour. At 9.30 am 185 NSS volunteers along with their 3 Program Officers went to Dayalpur. Swachtta Abhiyan took place in which all the volunteers participated with great enthusiasm.

A special lecture was delivered by the chairperson of Department of Psychology from Kurukshetra University Dr. Ranjana. She delivered lecture on Stress Management and Stress Busting Management. She gave various tips i.e positive mindset, fight and flight technique, psychology and physiology aspects, talking therapy, sport activities etc

Another special lecture by President awardee Mrs. Monika Bhardwaj founder member of Green Earth NGO. She talked about sanitation and hygiene. She talked about the importance of washing hands, basic hygiene, precautions while using public utilities, personal cleanliness etc. This session was conducted at Aangwadi of Dayalpur in which females from the village were specially invited and a separate session was held later in just female volunteers and females from village were gathered only.

After that Gynaecologist Tritpal Kaur from Saraswasti Mission Hospital, Kurukshetra delivered lecture to female volunteers and females from village on personal health care, menstrual hygiene and PCOD.

### Day 3 (09 February, 2020)

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers along with NSS song. This session continued for next one hour.

After breakfast in morning session special lecture through projector screen was delivered by Executive Member of Green Earth NGO Dr. Naresh Bhardwaj on the topic Solid Waste Management, Segregation of Dry and Wet waste material, most importantly the role of individual and community in decomposing waste material. He motivated the volunteers to step ahead for keeping surroundings clean and how to make compost through separation of waste and dry waste material.

After lunch, first aid and home nursing training was given by Shri Rajinder Saini and Road Safety by Subedar Major Rajender Khaushik. He gave live examples of what activities to be performed in the case of emergency i.e. heart attack, accident, unconsciousness, lack of breathing etc. Volunteers actively participated in this and followed the same procedure as he did. In Road Safety session importance of helmet, traffic rules, 20-20-20 rule 20 minutes skipping, 20 minutes mediation and 20 minutes any good book. Children and villagers also gathered to receive the training.

Later Nukkad Natak was performed by the volunteers at Chopal on the theme of plastic and it's danger. The play was highly appreciated by the villagers.

### Day 4 (10 February, 2020)

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers along with NSS song. This session continued for next one hour.

After then, Mr. Sohan Lal Saini Ji from (Retired from Mathematics Dept. Kuk in 2010) (PHD) interacted with NSS (UTD) volunteers and he give lecture on Environmental Protection. Nowadays he is running an NGO. Which he started with the help of his friends support. He told the students that he did the tree plantation near Bhrama Sarovar. He and many more peoples were indulged to make bricks gargage where the wet and dry waste separately are thrown. His Society Name earlier was "YES" but nowadays it changed to "HES". He had consulted from ayurveda specialist where he came to know that drinking while eating is like a poison. Whereas we may eat hot food after eating cold food. But we

may not eat cold food after hot eating hot food. Furthermore the call have also came to him from Canada while watching his work for the society, customer was also willing to contribute to plant trees by side of his full family. He was surprised that he got a call from Canada and then sohan lal saini asked him that why you wanna contribute here, then he replid that, No doubt country is different but our globe is same. Moreover discussion was also on YAM which is natural law that is for maintaing self growth. NIYAM is what who controls YAM that is for maintaining the society laws. He was enlighting his speech that NGT had passed the order that had banned on RO Water Purifier. He said that nowadays the company who makes an advertisement on fairness cream and beauty products they may be prosecuted for 6 Years with fine of 5 lakhs.

#### Day 5 (11 February, 2020)

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers. After that NSS song was performed. This session continued for one hour.

At 9.30 am 185 NSS volunteers along with their 3 Program Officers went to Dayalpur. A plantation drive was initiated by NSS (UTD) volunteers. They planted 15 roses plant all over the main area also made boundaries with bricks to protect it at Bhaan Ganga temple area. Volunteers actively participated in beautification of the village.

Later after lunch all the volunteers went to Gurukul fields to see the concept of Sustainable farming, zero budget or organic farming, where Mr. Shamshar Singh delivered lecture on Natural farming and guided volunteers during field tour about chemical free farming and their benefits in future. The difference between organic farming and non organic farming can be easily identified. Field visits motivated volunteers to guide not only farmers but also people around to adopt organic farming. He enlighten his speech by telling that the most of farming is done within Haryana and Punjab in which chemical, pesticides & DAP are used. . He focused on producing Quality products instead of increasing quantity of the crops. He also given a logical reason that why the flood is coming so frequently. (The Land by getting barren, the water inside the land goes to the sea. He has given example of "Cancer Train" of Punjab as due to excessive usage of pesticides leads to cancer. Currently gurukul is doing organinc farming in more than 180 acres. He quoted the example of Mr. Subhash Palikar who got (Padam Shree Award in Agriculture Department at the Post of ADO). In the

Beginning of their experiment, they have produced the crops at 150 acres. He had done his work in sahitya also. His 2 children were engineer but they are nowadays working at SPNP Site. The Gujarat peoples also visited the gurukul. He lived there with acharya devrath for 4 years. By watching the work of subhash palekar, the farmers also attend and visit his shivir (Camp).. He further said that on 12th March 2020, Chief minister, City council, and another VIP are also coming. They have to compulsorily attend 6 days camp for getting what they are doing. With the help of 100 Cows urine and Gobar & also other Natural Resources the crops are being produced. With the help of 1 gram gobar, the 300 crores suksham jeev are born. From 1st April to 5th April they will organize a camp that about how and how much to grow the crops. For attending camp they have to register under DDA so that the money of the village should remain inside the village only. Earlier barter system was there in the village where wheat was exchanged with any other thing. However we are now incurring more cost for producing crops comparison to earlier time. Nirmala Sitaraman will rebate electicity bill if the farmer is getting indulged in producing organic crops.

He asked the volunteers whose parents are in farming profession then he further indulged in his speech by saying that you have to encourage the parents for the organic farming. He also said that the khaad is being ready in 3 days and they have to use it within 10 days. Their products are fair enough in cost. But students used to ask many questions about it then he further gotta know to the students that the farmers know how to produce the crops but the don't know how to sell it..

In Bombay the Anil Ambani Family has its own 4 acres land on which organic food items are grown which is good for their health. Furthermore the Dehradun Central Govt Agency had also given the gurukul a certification for their embarrassing work. Students also saw at gurukul a tree which was containing uncountable nests inside it there were many colourful Birds that was really the best moment ever saw by all of us which was containing a beautiful surroundings.

While visiting to the farm house, there were number of crops like black wheat (demolish cancer), and hira moti (which reduces suger) Carrat, radish, tea leaves etc. which were grown at a place of price ₹200 each per kg. ... As such volunteer got the knowledge that how the crops should be grown. also if we are making the crop grow of sugercane then even after cutting that crop 3 times we may continue to have that crop 4th time also. The Sugercane is grown more in the area of Maharashtra because of the hot climate. They (Gurukul peoples) are producing the organic crops from 5 years and also chemical crops are from 3 years. If we

grow organic crops then the small herbs are coming more in comparison to chemical one crops.

### Day 6 (12 February, 2020)

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers. After that NSS song was performed. This session continued for one hour.

At 9.30 am 185 NSS volunteers along with their 3 Program Officers went to Dayalpur.

In morning session Swachhta Abhiyan started in which all the four units were scattered throughout the village for cleaning. Small group were made and after that they performing various activities like started picking all the garbage, road cleaning, draining all the waste material, during these activities, villagers themselves motivated the volunteers by providing them extra equipments, offering them milk and water. Volunteers planted 40 plants all over the main area also made boundaries with bricks to protect it. Volunteers actively participated in beautification of the village.

After lunch, special lecture was delivered by Dr. Sanjeev Arora from Chemistry Department, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. He talked about 7 types of plastic, know your plastic and Plastic reuse. Another interesting topic he talked about is Scientific logics behind old myths. Sanjeev Arora (Lecturer in Dept. Of Chemistry) (PHD) came & said the students that he had done his work on polymer composition. He further elaborated about various types of polythene like : macromolecule which contain highest \*Ethene\*. He have given a thought of mindset that how to know your plastic. \*First of all,\* we come to know about the plastic that which plastic polythene contains through \*Resix Index Coding (RIC)\* .

He introduced about 7 types of plastic:

1). PET (contain 1no. Downside the plastic bottle)

2). High Density Polythene (eg. thick polythene)

3).PBC (Rug Plastic like : Pipe, bottle cap, another strong plastic).

4).Low Density Polythene (thin polythene)

5).Poly Proplene (PP) : The plastic which can't be crushed

6).Sterophome (eg. Thermocoal).. In which we usually drink tea.

7).Polycarbonate (Another rest plastics).

There are various kinds of \*polythene\*:

1).Black polythene: It is Recycled already 4-5 times. And given a colour of black. We have to use this to through waste in dustbin

2).Green, Blue, Red polythene: It is Recycled already 1 time.

3).White polythene: It is not recycled.

Furthermore he told NSS Volunteers that sachet was developed in 1970. He said that shampoo and other products which are coming in the form of \*pouch\* will be banned in 2021. Because it causes sea water blocked. He awared the students about corona virus. Where in that area who has virus inside him and other person even sneeze near that area (the other person will also have the same disease). Near about 1Crore and 25 lakh (approx) peoples live in China. In 2050, the fishes in the sea will remain half in comparison to nowadays. We have to use less polythene & also need to tell this thing to others so that everyone may be aware. Instead of taking polythene from seller, we have to take a cloth bag. More than 25 Microns bag is not used in the India. Steel bottle, copper bottle, & glass bottle have to be used instead of plastic bottles. Thermo coal plates causes cancer. Thermocoal cup in which we usually drink hot tea is very bad for our health but if we drink cold drink then it just cause an effect to environment and \*not to human health\*. The Dress which an Indian cricket team wears are make from number 1 plastic. In the India, in a day, 1 crore straws are used.

He also introduced the scientific idea about the myth...

1. When Cat cross our way when we are going anywhere.. We need to turn round in  $360^{\circ}$  angle.

Later, innovative idea "Self Defense for women" was launched. The session was conducted with the support and guidance of S.P. Astha Modi. ASI Taro Devi along with Head Constable Balveer Kaur and Parveen Devi, Nirmala Devi. They taught about self defense techniques, Durga Shakti App and ways to keep oneself safe i.e. paper spray, shouting, kicking between the legs, punching on nose, hitting in eyes.

In the end Nukkad Natak was performed on the theme of Plastic and it's hazard to environment with the message of Say No To Plastic. The play was highly appreciated by the the villagers and they agreed to reduce less plastic. Shefali from Department of Hindi recited Rashmi Rathi.

### 7 Day (13 February, 2020)

At 7.30 in the morning Yoga and Prayer session was held in which all the volunteers performed various exercises and yoga followed by devotional prayers. After that NSS song was performed. This session continued for one hour.

At 9.30 am 185 NSS volunteers along with their 3 Program Officers went to Dayalpur.


In morning session Swachhta Abhiyan started in which all the four units were scattered throughout the village for cleaning. #### 1. N.S.S. Activities (January, 2019 onwards to December, 2019)






#### **Brief Report**

#### <u>2020-21</u>

- On 02-08-2020, the N.S.S. (UTD) volunteers participated in Nari Shakti Manthan Webinar organized by Sashakt Yuva Foundation where Chief Minister of Haryana had discussion session with women and listened to their suggestions and answered their queries.
- During the lockdown, to promote physical fitness among the students N.S.S. (UTD) gave a fitness challenge to the volunteers in the form of Rope Skipping Competition. Around 45 students participated in the competition and submitted their videos.
- iii) During the lockdown while classes were run in online mode, the NSS volunteers were motivated through lectures and demonstration to start a month long waste segregation activity at their respective native places. 39 volunteers segregated their waste into dry and wet. Further made compost from the wet waste. 29 students successfully completed the task daily for 30 days (15-10-2020 to 15-11-2020). They also motivated their neighbors and relative to do the same. During online monitoring sessions, they narrated their experience and their enthusiasm for the task was quite evident during these interactive sessions. The students were awarded certificate by the Green Earth NGO for their dedication towards environment cause.
- iv) On day of National Unity Day, a capacity building lecture by Advocate Mahima Singh was organized for the NSS volunteers followed by the discussion session. On the day, slogan writing, poster making and one-minute video composition on theme of National Unity Day were announced. In total 59 students participated.



- ix) International Yoga Day was observed by NSS volunteers who also motivated their family members to adopt Yoga in their daily routine.







- July, 2021 to September, 2021

#### Seven Day and Night Special Camp at Village Dayalpur

Under the directions of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Som Nath Sachdeva and Dean Students' Welfare Prof. Anil K. Vashisth, a Seven Day and Night Special Camp on theme "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (Clean, Healthy and Self-Reliant India)" was organized by N.S.S. (U.T.D.) from 09 to 15 November, 2021 at village Dayalpur under the guidance and supervision of N.S.S. programme Officers Dr. Sangeeta and Dr. Manisha Sandhu. The details of activities (date-wise) are presented below:

#### DAY 1

The day started with Yoga and meditation session in the early morning with N.S.S. volunteer Mr. Krishan leading the session. The benefits of Yoga and meditation were discussed with the volunteers and emphasis was laid on the importance of 'sukshma vyayama'. After Breakfast, the volunteers reached the village where Dr. Sangeeta briefed them about the theme of the camp as well as the code of conduct which volunteers had to adhere during the entire duration of the camp. The ice-breaking session was conducted where volunteers one-by-one introduced themselves to others and talked about their hobbies as well as about their reasons for being an N.S.S. volunteer. Thereafter, several committees were allotted to volunteers. Such as-Operational Committee, Food Committee, Cultural Committee, Discipline Committee, Arts and Craft Committee, Attendance Committee and Photography - Media Committee. The students were briefed about the role and duties of members of different committees. Talking to the volunteers Dr. Sangeeta stressed upon the importance of discipline and determination in life. She emphasized any goal can be achieved with sheer determination and hard work. Afterwards volunteers carried out cleanliness campaign in the village. The volunteers were divided into different teams and team leaders were elected. The team leaders took the round of the village and based on the information provided by these team leaders, Programme officers assigned each team a particular area for cleaning. The different teams collected plastic waste from streets, common gathering places and from the vicinity of ponds of the village. While collecting the plastic waste, volunteers also educated villagers to avoid single use plastic items and to get rid of waste not to burn it. They informed the villagers that burning waste

especially plastic releases harmful gases in air that deteriorates human and animal health. Towards the end of the day, the programme officers Dr. Sangeeta and Dr. Manisha Sandhu took a round of the village along with the volunteers to inspect the impact of cleanliness drive. During the round, volunteers saw several taps are in need of repair due to which water wastage was taking place. Volunteers discussed and told the villagers about the importance of water and informed them about the current status of ground water reserves and looming water crisis. After the inspection round, programme officers appreciated the hard work of the volunteers and the best two teams which led the task were announced. Ms. Simran (Deptt. of Hindi) an N.S.S. volunteer and a native of Dayalpur led the team which obtained first position while second position went to team led by Ms. Manisha (Deptt. of Chemistry). All the volunteers appreciated the efforts of each other and the day one ended on upbeat note. The possible sites for tree-plantation were also identified during the round.









### DAY 2

Everyday started with Yoga session in the morning. The session was conducted by Mr. Krishan and Mr. Parteek. On day two, Prof. S.L. Saini, President, Haryana Environmental Society (NGO) talked to volunteers about the importance of tree plantation and told them that tree plantation drives should also equally focus on nurturing the saplings post plantation. He talked about his own experience of setting up a self-sustainable NGO build on the model of public involvement. Under his supervision, the tree plantation site was finalized and work on the preparation of the

site for plantation was initiated. The enthusiastic response of students towards environmental cause also motivated the villagers and H.E.S. agreed to donate the sapling for plantation on the site. In the evening, a lecture by Dr. Ashok Kumar, Sub-Inspector, HSNCB on Drug Abuse was organized. An awareness rally against drug abuse was conducted.







### <u>3.</u> <u>National Youth Day (12-01-2022)</u>






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### <u>4.</u> <u>National Voters' Day (25-01-2022)</u>














#### <u>5.</u> <u>75 Crore Surya Namaskar (15-02-2022)</u> Launch of month-long Yoga Activity

#### <u>6.</u> <u>Waste Management Activity</u> <u>Eco-Brick from Plastic Waste</u>

N.S.S. (U.T.D.), Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra has been constantly motivating the volunteers over past years to manage their waste. The volunteers have been trained to segregate their wet and dry waste by maintaining two separate dustbins. They have been made aware about the process of composting their wet waste. Under dry waste, the volunteers have been told to segregate the electronic, glass, cardboard, aluminium foils, paper and plastic waste. The special focus was laid onto managing the plastic waste. They were told to minimize the use of plastic and for disposing off the packaging plastic waste, the volunteers were trained to prepare an ECOBRICK. They were motivated to submit at least either ONE 2 litre capacity EcoBrick or TWO 1 litre capacity Ecobrick. The formation of EcoBrick was demonstrated to volunteers and the video of the same demonstration was circulated. The volunteers registered online for this activity and 62 students participated in the activity. The volunteers filled the EcoBrick over a course of 20 days and once full, the EcoBricks were submitted to the Programme Officers.

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
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

#### Seven Day and Night Special Camp at Village Mathana

Under the directions of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Som Nath Sachdeva and Dean Students' Welfare Prof. Anil K. Vashisth, a Seven Day and Night Special Camp on theme "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (Clean, Healthy and Self-Reliant India)" was organized by N.S.S. (U.T.D.) from 23 to 29 March, 2022 at village Mathana under the guidance and supervision of N.S.S. programme Officers Dr. Sunil Kumar and Dr. Dipti Choudhary. The details of activities (date-wise) are presented below:

#### DAY 1

On 23 March 2022, under the aegis of Amrit Mahotsav of Independence, a seven-day camp was launched by the unit of National Service Scheme of Kurukshetra University, which took place in village Mathana of Kurukshetra district. Being a martyrdom day, the importance of this day increases even more because the entire nation remembers the sacrifice of its three martyrs Bhagat Singh, Rajguru and Sukhdev. In the program, Sarpanch of Gram Panchayat Mathana, Mr. Tejpal was the chief guest and the head of the temple management committee of the village, Mr. Suresh was present as a special guest.
