3. Exchange of relevant Academic Materials will be carried out subject to the mutual agreement of both institutions.

## ARTICLE III

The implementation of cooperation based on this MOU shall be dealt with between the relevant faculties and Divisions/ Departinents of both the institutions. Wherever necessary, specific plan shall be worked gut for each activity setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration. Such plans shall be subject to the approval of the appropriate authorities of each institution. To facilitate the development of such plans, each institution shall nominate a member of its staff to coordinate activities arising under this MOU.

Both institutions agree and undertake to keep confidential at all times any information and/or data that may be exchanged, acquired and/or shared in connection with the area of cooperation as mentioned above unless otherwise the same information already exists in the public domain.

## ARTICLE V

Ownership of any findings of any joint research shall be vested in both institutions to this MOU and any publications regarding the same shalt only be possible after prior approval from both institutions.

## ARTICLE VI

The MOU shall remain in force for a period of 10 (TEN) years commencing from the date of signing and may be reviewed by mutual consent by serving 3 (Three) months written notice to the other institution. Upon renewal, both institutions shall select either to proceed with the existing or new terms of understanding.

## ARTICLE VII

## Memorandum of Understanding between Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and CEERI, Pilani to promote aeademic and research interaction and cooperation

 This Memorandum of Understanding entered into on the $22^{\text {hd }}$ day of March, 2018 between the Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra (hereinafter referred to as KU and Central Electronics Engineering Research Institute, Pilani Rajasthan (hereinafter referred to as CEERI) desired to promote academic and research interaction and cooperation between the two institutes.
## 1. Objectives

1.1 KU and CEERI Pilani will undertake joint Sponsored Research and Consultancy Project within the specified Areas of Cooperation.
1.2 Project proposals will be formulated jointly by the concerned faculty of KU and staff members of CEERI.
1.3 Such joint proposals would require the approval of both KU and CEERI.
1.4 Joint Sponsored Projects could be undertaken with both long-terms and short-terms goals in Keeping with interests and philosophies of the respective Institutions.
2. Exchange / Deputation of Staff:
2.1 Both KU and CEERI agree to exchange staff through deputation on full-time/part-time basis for a limited period and up to one year at a time for the purpose of implementation of jeint tasks within the Areas of Cooperation. Staff members on such deputation shall be deemed to be on duty with the parent organization for the said period.
2.2 Both Institutions shall encourage lectures from faculty/staff at the other institution in the Areas of Cooperation. Visiting seientists and teachers from either Institution shall be paid honorarium by the host institution for the lectures delivered at mutually agreed rates by the host institution.
2.3 There shall be a provision whereby eminent Visiting Scientists/Professors with Specialization in the Areas of Cooperation at either Institution will be encouraged to visit the other Institution.
2.4 The local travel and local hospitality expenditures shall be borne by the host institution.

## 3. Joint Conference/Workshop/Courses:

3.1 Both Institutes agree to hold/conduct, whenever feasible, joint workshops/conferences/training courses within the Areas of Cooperation.
3.2 The host Institution shall provide free accommodation to the participating members from the visiting institutes wherever feasible.

## 4. Sharing of Facilities:

4.1 The two institutes agree to share their respective important R \& D facilities in order to promote academic and research interaction in Areas of Cooperation.
4.2 The two institutes agree to exchange software and other materials and components developed in house in the Areas of Cooperation if permissible within the rules governing the two instifutions.

## 5. Ph.D Registration:

5.1 Up to 10 staff member or Research Fellow/Research Associates of CEERI working on approved joint project at any given time may be registered for the Ph.D at the nodal point at KU. There shall be provision for joint supervision with appropriate staff of CEERI in conformity with the rules and norms for $\mathrm{Ph} . \mathrm{D}$ research guidance at KU .
5.2 Access to CEERI laboratory, library and accommodation facilities for jointly supervised Ph.D students (in the areas of mutual interest) and a limited number of already registered Ph.D students generally stationed at Kurukshetra University will be 6 month at a stretch subject to maximum total duration of two years at the most on reciprocal basis during the tenure of Ph.D work.

## 6.Coordination Committee:

6.1 The following will constitute the Coordination Committee to coordinate and monitor the collaborative programme between the two institutions:
a. Vice-Chancellor, KU or his nominee
b. Director, CEERI or his nominee
c. Coordinator from KU- Prof.Anurekha Sharma

## d. Coordinator from CEERI- Dr. Senjay Singh

The identified areas of research along with the project representatives from KU and CEERI respectively are given below.

### 6.2 The Coordination Committee shall:

a. Review the progress of the identified programmes minimum once a year.
b. Consider the new R \& D proposals for joint collaboration and implementation on case to case basis including IPR and financial arrangement.
c. Consider the continuance of the MOU.

## 7. ARBITRATION

ii) The Kurukshetra University after the selection of student for ONGC Scholarship will intimate Head ONGC Academy, Kaulagarh Road, Dehradun through. a written report giving detail of the student selected. Biodata and photograph of the selected student will also be enclosed with the report.
iii) The Kurukshetra University will send a written demand note to Head, ONGC Academy, Kaulagarh Road, Dehradun for release of the fund for four ONGC Scholarships in an academic year for disbursement to the ONGC Scholars.
iv) The Kurukshetra University will receive the fund for ONGC Scholarships from ONGC and will disburse the same to the ONGC Scholars regularly.

Defence Institute of Psychological Research (DIPR), through its Director presently Dr. Manas K. Mandal, Sc 'H' duly authorized in this regard. (herein after referred to as DIPR)

The expressions of KUK and DIPR shall, however, mean and include the Institutions/Organisations, their successors, appointees, assignees etc.

## Now this Memorandum of Understanding Witnessth:

1. DIPR, Delhi will be a 'Research Affiliate' of KUK.
2. There will be collaboration between the academic faculties of KUK and the scientists and officers of DIPR in the areas of common interests.
3. This collaboration will extend the facilities of the two Institutions/labs for complementing joint research projects and to train each other's students / faculties to facilitate research and training in the area of behavioural sciences.
4. The two Institutions will conduct joint programs including courses and training as per mutual interest.
5. Wherever there is potential for research funding from national / international agencies, the applications for such funding areas of mutual interest may be pursued jointly after obtaining permission of the Competent Authority (DRDO HQrs) and the office of the Vice Chancellor, KUK.

- 6. Research Students working at DIPR be allowed to register for PH.D. degree to be awarded by KUK. Eligible DIPR Scientists and the


Professors from KIK will either be the supervisor or co-supervisor, depending on the expertise and the topic of research pursued by the scholar. By-laws of KUK governing the admission and award of Ph.D. degree will apply to such joint Ph.D. program.
7. The stay and working of Ph.D. candidates from DIPR in the institute during the period of research will be considered as residency period and they will be considered as regular scholars by KUK.
8. KUK, after getting approval from appropriate academic body of the university, will recognize and certify the academic training courses conducted by DIPR in collaboration with Department of Psychology, KUK from time-to-time for officers of DRDO and Indian Armed Forces.
9. Ph.D. students working at KUK will be able to carry out a part of their work at DIPR and if needed a DIPR scientist may be a co-guide.
10. KUK and DIPR will cover the cost of rescarch journals and other expenditure incurred in connection with the research collaboration, at their respective levels.
11. DIPR will provide short-term training to students and faculry members of KUK in their areas of specialization on the formal request from the University. A maximum of 4 such requests per year will be accepted.
12. Scientists of DIPR may be invited to deliver lectures in specific courses or seminars of KUK.
13. Mobility of Professors / Faculties of KUK and Scientists and officers of DIPR between KUK and DIPR for attending and/or delivering lectures in short term courses not exceeding the duration of a fortnight like Continuing Education Programs or Refrester Courses will be encouraged. The financial implications of the same will be borne by the organising institution.
14. Any issue arising on intellectual property rights ownership, sharing etc. especially in National or International agencies' funded projects will be

15. This MOU will come into force on the date of its signature by both parties and will be in force for a period of ten years (if not terminated). This MOU may be extended/amended by mutual consent in writing by both the parties.
16. This MOU may be terminated by either institution at any time provided that the terminating institution forwards written notices of intention to terminate atleast six months prior to termination but not within the first three years.
17. In case of any dispute arising out of this Memorandum of Understanding or in its enforcement the concerned parties to this MOU will resolve the same amicably by mutual consent of both the parties. However, in case the dispute remains unresolved it shall be referred to an arbitrator to be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties subject to Delhi/Kurukshetra jurisdiction. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding upon both the concemed parties.

## 5. Statutory Compliances:

a. Firm shall obtain all registrations(s)/permission(s)/License(s) etc. which are/may be required under any legislation(s) for providing the services under this memorandum of understanding.
b. It shall be the Firm's responsibility to ensure compliance of all the Central and State Government Rules \& Regulations and rules of the local bodies with regard to the provisions of the services under this memorandum of understanding. The Firm indemnifies and shall always keep University indemnified against all losses, damages and claims actions taken against University by any authority/office in this regard.
c. The Firm undertakes to comply with the applicable provisions of such legislations for carrying out the purpose of this memorandum of understanding. The Firm shall further observe and comply with all Government Laws concerning providing of such services. ## 9. Losses Suffered by Firm:

The Firm shall not claim any damages, costs, charges expenses, liabilitics arising out of performance/non-performance of services, which it may suffer or otherwise incur by reason of any act/omission, negligence, default or error in judgment on part of itself and/or its

10. Term:

Waiver, if any, has to be in writing.
21. Force Majeure:

Neither party shall be in default if a failure to perform any obligation hereunder is caused solely by supervening conditions beyond that party's reasonable control, including acts of God, civil commotion, strikes, acts of terrorism, labour disputes and governmental or public authority's demands or requirements.

## 22. Dispute Resolution:

a. This memorandum of understanding shall be deemed to have been mode/executed at Kurukshetra for all purpose. In the event of any dispute related to the interpretation or rights or liabilities arising

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out of this memorandum of understanding, the same shall, at first instance, be amicably settled between the parties. If any dispute is not settled amicably, the same shall be referred to the sole arbitrator to be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor. The award given by the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the parties. The venue of arbitration shall be at Kurukshetra or as decided by the University.
b. If any doubt or ambiguity arises as to the meaning and /or effect of any provisions of the memorandum of understanding, the same shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor for clarification and his decision thereon shall be final and binding on both parties.
c. Whenever there is duplication in any clause either in the terms and conditions of this tender or in those of the memorandum of understanding, the clause which is considered more beneficial to Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra will be taken final.

## 23. Governing Law/Jurisdiction:

The applicable law governing this memorandum of understanding shall be the laws of India and the courts of Kurukshetra shall have the exclusive jurisdiction to try any dispute with respect to this memorandum of understanding.

The MOU is made on the 16 th day of July month in the year 2019, at Kurukshetra, Haryana, between Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra (hereinafter referred as "University") through Kurukshetra University RUSA Project Society, Kurukshetra (KURPS) which expression shall, unless excluded by or repugnant to the context, mean the Member Secretary, KURPS, Kurukshetra and include his/her successor in office, legal representative, nominee and assignee as the First Party.

## AND

MEDHA LEARNING FOUNDATION (hereinafter referred as "Medha"), Lucknow, registered as a not-forprofit Company under Section 8 (erstwhile Section 25 ) of The Companies Act, 2013, which expression shall include, unless excluded by or repugnant to the context, mean the Executive Director, and include his/her successor in office, legal representative, nominee and assignee as the Second Party.

## WHEREAS

The University has established a Corporate Resource Centre (CRC) under KURPS to build and promote industry-academia interface, with a focus on enhancing employability skills and employment outcomes of students graduating from the University and its affiliated colleges. KURPS has collaborated with Medha for strengthening the CRC as its "Knowledge \& Capacity Building" partner.

This MOU defines and details the general framework of the collaboration as under:

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

### 1.1 DEFINITIONS

(a) "University" means Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, Haryana.
(b) "KURPS" means Kurukshetra University RUSA Project Society.
(c) "Project" means the project implemented by Medha in collaboration with KURPS in pursuant to this MOU.
(d) "Centre" means the operational office of the Corporate Resource Centre under KURPS.
(e) "Programme" means the employability bootcamp, training \& capacity building, industry events and other career services activities performed by the CRC.
(f) "BOG" means Board of Governors, KURPS.


### 1.2 RELATION BETWEEN THE PARTIES

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as establishing the relation of purchaser and seller as between the first and second party. The second party, subject to this MOU, shall have complete charge of personnel implementing the Project and shall be fully responsible for the task completed by them.

### 1.3 GOVERNING LAW \& JURISDICTION

This MOU, its meaning and interpretation, and the relation between the parties shall be governed by the laws applicable in India and they only shall have exclusive Jurisdiction over matters relating to or arising from this MOU.
1.4 LANGUAGE

This MOU has been executed in English language, which shall be the binding and controlling language for all matters relating to the meaning of interpretation of this MOU .

### 1.5 LOCATION

The matter i.e. Project implementation arising under this MOU shall be performed by the secona party from its head offices at Lucknow and/or its nearest regional office, in addition to the Centre at the University as agreed upon by the first party.

### 1.6 AUTHORISED REPRESENTATIVES

Any action required or permitted to be taken and any document required or permitted to be executed under this MOU may be taken or executed
(a) On behalf of the first party, by the Chairman, BOG, KURPS, Kurukshetra, or his/her designated representative:
(b) On behalf of the second party, by the Executive Director, Medha Learning Foundation, or his/her designated representative.

## 2. COMMENCEMENT, COMPLETION, MODIFICATION AND TERMINATION OF THIS MOU

2.1 This MOU shall come into force from the date of signing, or other earlier date that is mutually agreed by the two parties.
2.2 Modification of the terms and conditions of this MOU, including the modification of the Project may be made at the time of annual review, with mutual agreement between the parties.
2.3 The MOU shall be effective for a period of three years, but KURPS will review/renew/modify (if needed) the MOU annually, based on the project outputs/outcomes.

2.4 The MOU may be terminated prematurely by either party with mutual agreement by giving one month's notice.

The role and obligation of Medha and the University will be as under:

## 3. ROLE \& OBLIGATION OF THE SECOND PARTY "MEDHA" UNDER THE COLLABORATION

3.1 Medha shall support the University team in developing employability training modules, piloting the modules with students, Training of Trainers of the faculty appointed by the University for employability training, building industry interface for greater engagement, managing the training \& placement information system and mainstreaming employability training into University education.
3.2 Medha shall provide its employability (training) bootcamps' curriculum \& pedagogy expertise to the University - focusing on Life skills, Digital literacy, Communication skills and Job readiness.
3.3 Medha shall also deliver the employability (training) bootcamps in the pilot stage through its own Trainers to selected students registered at the CRC. The ultimate goal of direct delivery shall be to build the capacities of the Centre to train the student using its own trainers/faculty members.
3.4 Medha shall also bring its expertise pertaining to career services, viz. skill assessment, industry workshops, internships \& placement drives, alumni engagement etc, to the Centre under the Project.
3.5 Medha shall provide Training of Trainers \& capacity building support to trainers/faculty nominated by the Centre for delivering employability training, placement and other career services to the students. Medha shall support the University in creating necessary systems \& processes for allocation/empanelment/appointment of trainers and other resources required at the Centre.
3.6 Medha shall work with the University during the Project period for mainstreaming employability training in the University/college education.
3.7 Medha shall prepare a detailed workplan for Programme Implementation in consultation with the Centre and shall follow the same once approved by the University.
3.8 Medha shall abide by all the rules and regulations of the University in the functioning of Centre at the University:
3.9 Medha shall furnish all relevant information, including the workplan, progress reports and impact reports if any corresponding to the Project, to the University as and when required or demanded by the latter.

3.10 Medha shall not charge any service fee from the CRC for the implementation of the Project. However, the University/Centre shall cover the associated overhead costs under the Project viz. workstation for Medha personnel, travel \& accommodation of trainers, engagement of external experts, printing \& stationery, training materials \& equipment and other costs associated with organizing industry events etc. in the implementation of the Programme. Such arrangements shall be made directly by the University/Centre and no payments shall be made to Medha or any of its personnel engaged directly/indirectly in the Programme.

## 4. ROLE \& OBLIGATION OF THE FIRST PARTY "KURPS" UNDER THE COLLABORATION

4.1 The University shall provide necessary infrastructure at the CRC, for the implementation of various activities under the Programme.
4.2 The University shall implement a central MIS for managing Training \& Placement of its students through the CRC.
4.3 The University shall make necessary arrangements to implement the Programme on a sustainable basis, through allocation/empanelment/appointment of trainers and other resources required at the CRC.
4.4 The University shall seek recommendation from Medha/CRC for mainstreaming employability training in the University/college education.
4.5 The University shall nominate a single point of contact to facilitate and troubleshoot the Project at the University.
4.6 The University shall ensure full support and cooperation to Medha in all aspects of the Project implementation.
5. REPORTING OBLIGATION

The Second Party shall submit to the First Party reports and documents as may be specified and at such frequency as may be agreed upon between the two parties. The Second Party will collect and maintain the records of students served from the Centre and shall monitor and report their progress to the First Party.

## 6. ARBITRATION

Both the parties shall use all reasonable endeavors to resolve or settle the disputes through mutual negotiation and discussions in connection with this MOU or the interpretation thereof, Any and all disputes, controversies and conflicts ("Disputes") arising out of this MOU between the parties or arising out of or relating to or in connection with this MOU or the performance or non-performance of the rights and obligations set forth herein or the breach, termination,

invalidity or interpretation thereof which cannot be settled or resolve amicably shall be referred for arbitration to a suitable committee at Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The arbitral award shall be in writing and shall be final and binding on each party and shall be enforceable in any court of competent jurisdiction. None of the parties shall be entitled to commence or maintain any action in a court of law upon any Dispute arising out of or relating to or in connection with this MOU.

## 7. CONSEQUENCE OF BREACH AND PENALTIES

a. It shall be obligatory on part of either party to ensure timely Project implementation and facilitation as per the pre-approved workplan as agreed upon in the MoU.
b. In the event of breach of any term or conditions of this agreement, either party shall have the right to terminate the agreement and recover costs incurred that are associated with the project.

Located in the holy city of Kurukshetra, land of the historical battle of 'Mahabharata' and the great message of Bhagwad Gita, its campus is situated on the western bank of Brahm Sarover (the holy tank) and extends over an area of over 400 acres. Starting with only the Department of Sanskrit, it has grown into a multi-faculty University as one of the premier centres for advances study and research in the region. The Institute of Sanskrit and Indological Studics known for its major research project of Mahabharata Word Concordance and the Digest Prachi Jyoti, plans to hold workshops, seminars, short term courses in future to connect with students and people who are interested in attaining Indological awareness.

(f) "College" shall mean a college affiliated to/managed by the "university" under its affiliation provisions/rules/regulations.
(g) "Course or Online Learning Course" shall mean the Workx Integrated Programs offered by the University in the Online Learning mode/ Blended mode utilizing the services of Schoolguru.
(h) "Blended Learning" shall mean a course of program being delivered using a combination of multiple classrooms ( In -Class face-to-face, Online andon-thejob).
(i) "Students" shall mean individuals who are admitted to the Courses. An individual who is admitted as a student continues to that the maximum period successfully completes the Courseorn readmission period expires;
(i) "Course Design" will include defining various aspects of the course including learning objectives, curriculum (syllabus), stassessment/examination; course material, activities, assignments and assessment,

(k) "Course Schedule" is the schedule for the commencement and key activities such as admission, assignments and assessments of the Courses being offered. The Courses may have one or more cycles that maybe modified based on consent of both parties;
(I) "Content" includes various modes of providing instructional material for a specific course as per the Course Design to a student and may include printed course material, online and offline video and audio, animation, presentations, activities, assignment, assessment and counseling as required at various stages;
(m) "Service" shall mean various services offered to the students by Schoolguru for a specified Course. This will commence from Course Design and include admission facilitation, collection of fees, content provisioning, examination facilitation and ends with facilitating certification;
(n) "Content and Quality Review Committee" or "Quality Committee" will be a fivemember committee jointly appointed by the University and Schoolguru. Two members of the committee will be nominated by Schoolguru and Three memhers including Chairman by the University. The committee will be responsible for oversight of the quality of services offered and may offer suggestions for the improvement of the service that will be incorporated by Schoolguru thereafter. WHEREAS，in order to support the Government of India（Got）in its efforts to address the food security and nutrition needs of the population，WFP has signed an MoU with the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmer＇s Welfare for the current CSP（2019－2023）for supporting the government＇s efforts towards achievement of sustainable development goal 2 by providing technical assistance and transfer and exchange of knowledge，skills and expertise to concretely

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strengthen the existing systems. The dialogue on the new $\operatorname{CSP}$ (2023-27) is currently underway extending the mandate to work on these aspects over the next 5 years, the MoU for which will be signed in early 2023.

Whereas aligned with the Partnership MoU with Gold, recognizing the potential areas for knowledge collaboration with Kurukshetra University (KU), a detailed proposal indicating potential areas, especially related to nutrition, climate change and gender equity and empowerment was shared with Kurukshetra University.
Whereas the Kurukshetra University (KU) established in 1956 is an A+ grade NAAC accredited university focused on preparing a class of proficient scholars and professionals with ingrained human values and commitment to expand the frontiers of knowledge for the advancement of society.

Whereas, World Food Programme (WFP), an autonomous joint subsidiary programme of the United Nations and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, with headquarters in Rome, Italy, acting through its country office in INDIA.
Whereas, through its Country Strategic Plan (CSP), WFP seeks to support the government of India in achieving its targets under Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 2 and 17 by capitalizing on its investments under four sub-targets of SDG 2:

- SDG 2.1: By 2030, end hunger and ensure access by all people, in particular the poor and people in vulnerable situations, including infants, to safe, nutritious and sufficient food all year round.
- SDG 2.2: By 2030, end all forms of malnutrition, including achieving, by 2025, the internationally agreed targets on stunting and wasting in children under 5 years of age, and address the nutritional needs of adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating women and older persons.
- SDG 2.3: By 2030, double the agricultural productivity and incomes of small-scale food producers, in particular women, indigenous peoples, family farmers, pastoralists and fishers, including through secure and equal access to land, other productive resources and inputs, knowledge, financial services, markets and opportunities for value addition and non-farm employment.
- SDG 2.4: By 2030, ensure sustainable food production systems and implement resilient agricultural practices that increase productivity and production, that help maintain ecosystems, that strengthen capacity for adaptation to climate change, extreme weather, drought, flooding and other disasters and that progressively improve land and soil quality.
Whereas, in order to support the Government of India in its efforts to address the food security and nutrition needs of the population, WFP has signed an MoU with the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmer's Welfare for the current CSP (2019-2023) which also includes focusing on issues of gender, climate change and nutrition among others. The dialogue on the new CSP (2023-27) is currently underway extending the mandate to work on these aspects over the next 5 years, the MoU for which will be signed in early 2023. To take forward these commitments in this agreement and the forthcoming MoU, WFP and KU seek to work together on research, capacity

building and policy advocacy relating to gender, climate change and nutrition (the "Project"). The objectives of this project are as under:
(i) To enhance gender equality and women empowerment through gender transformative approaches and gender mainstreaming around intra-household access to food, improved nutrition and social and financial inclusion;
(ii) To work in the climate resilience, adaptation and resilience building to establish scalable models to ensure that farthest are reached first with sustainable and resilience strategies;
(iii) To enhance the nutritional effectiveness of the Government's food-based safety nets (Targeted Public Distribution System, Mid-Day Meals and Integrated Child Development Services)by increasing knowledge of and demand for diverse, nutritious and fortified foods.
Whereas, WFP and KU seek to undertake a strategic knowledge collaboration to address the key challenges with respect to food and nutrition insecurity as scoped out in Annexure I.
Whereas, both WFP and KU recognize the importance and value of cooperating with each other and therefore desire to strengthen their relationship by entering into this Agreement with the purpose of providing a coherent, predictable and structured framework for collaboration to support the implementation of the Project.
Now therefore, it is agreed that parties shall engage in partnership and knowledge collaboration under this LoU and shall be guided as follows:


## Article I

## KU shall

1.1 Identify a Partnership Manager as well as focal points in the Women's Studies Research Centre, Department of Social Work, Home Science and Institute of Environmental Studies for regular dialogue, discussions and support to WFP. This Manager would be responsible supervision and coordination under this project and liaise with designated person/s from WFP.
1.2 Provide technical support on gender, climate change and nutrition in following areas:

- Research
- Community engagement
- Training and capacity building
- Oversight and monitoring
1.3 Support in broadening the implementation of activities across India through its network of partners in other states.
1.4 Support and guide any local partners hired by WFP to support implementation of project activities.


## Article II

WFP shall
2.1 Identify overall Partnership Manager and designated contacts for the three areas of collaboration (gender, nutrition and climate).

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2.2 Receive 2 interns per year from KU for their professional development.
2.3 Provide funds for key research and pilot activities, including consultations depending upon availability.
2.4 Consult with technical teams in KU for technical advice and support.
2.5 Prepare a Project Strategy and Implementation Plan for project implementation.
2.6 Undertake other activities as deemed necessary for smooth functioning of the project.

## Article III

## Together

3.1 WFP and KU will formulate a Steering Committee comprised of representatives from both the organizations that will meet quarterly (in person or virtually) to review the progress of implementation, etc.
3.2 KU and WFP shall jointly monitor progress of the project implementation and suggest solutions for addressing gaps.
3.3 KU and WFP shall jointly identify global/national best practices in supporting gender, climate change and nutrition
3.4 KU and WFP shall jointly document good practices/ success stories.
3.5 KU and WFP shall jointly issue and disseminate communications and advocacy related to the project such as press releases, publications, workshops etc.
3.6 Planning and organization of events for policy advocacy, including consultations or conferences.

## Article IV

4.1 The obligations of WFP and KU under this LoU are subject to the constitutional, financial and budgetary rules of WFP and any decision of WFP/KU.
4.2 Both sides agree to treat confidentially any sensitive information exchanged in the course of implementation of this LoU. Should either side wish to disclose such information to third parties it shall seek prior written concurrence from the other side.

## Article V

5.1 Any claims, controversies or disputes between the Parties arising under this Agreement or under any agreements and/or documents entered into in connection with this Agreement, shall be settled amicably through consultations or negotiations between the Parties to the Dispute and in accordance with Article VI (Settlement of Disputes) of the Basic Agreement between the Government of India and WFP.

## Article VI

6.1 Nothing in this Letter of Understanding or any document entered into in relation to this Letter of Understanding will imply a waiver or be construed as waiver, express or implied, by WFP, the United Nations or the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) of any privileges or immunity enjoyed by them pursuant to the 1946 Convention on Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations, the 1947 Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of

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Specialized Agencies, customary international law, other relevant international or national arrangements and under domestic law.

## Article VII

7.1 This LoU shall commence on the date the last of the Parties signs this LoU (the "Effective Date") and the total duration of the collaboration would be $31^{\text {st }}$ December 2027.
7.2 This LoU may be modified in writing by mutual consent between KU and WFP by exchange of letters.
7.3 This LoU shall enter into force upon signature by both KU and WFP.

Faculty members from either side may visit each other's institute to work and deliver lectures in the areas of teaching, coaching and research in Physical Education and sports. Faculty members from either side may deliver online lectures in the areas of teaching, coaching and research in Physical Education and sports.
2. Submission and execution of collaborative research and research projects.

Researchers from both sides, based on their interests, will be allowed to submit and / or execute a research project by getting international / national / in-house financial assistance. The Human performance lab, sports sciences lab and sports infrastructure may also be shared on mutual basis.

## 3. Sharing of knowledge and technology transfer.

Intellectual ideas and technical assistance will be shared in different areas of development of Physical education and sports sciences, high performance training, adventure sports activities and adventure Expeditions. Researchers from both sides can collaborate to write and publish research / review articles, book chapters and / or books. Both the institutions can organize national / international conferences, workshops, FDPs, training and orientation programs etc, in the field of Physical education and sports sciences.

## 4. Seminar/webinar series.

A seminar / webinar series will be conducted to enlighten the faculty and students about the latest developments in the selected areas by joint efforts.

5. Sharing of materials and services.

Exchange of academic materials and academic publications in the areas of Physical Education and Sports, Consultancy services provided by both institutions for carrying out special events that are related to Physical Education, Sports sciences, Wellness and Fitness Programme.
6. Extension activities.

The joint extension activities in the field of Physical education, sports, Yoga and Adventure sports will aid better results to perform social responsibility to the Nation. For this, various awareness programmes, training and coaching camps, yoga camps and adventure tours may be organized for Indian community.

## 7. Research students exchange programs.

Exchange of students for joint research program in the area of Physical Education and Sports Sciences, high performance training, Adventure Sports activities and Adventure Expeditions.
8. Jointly proposing and conducting new short-term skill development programmes.
Both the institutions can join hands in proposing and conducting new short-term skill development programmes at either for the campuses and will help each other in doing so.

Themes of joint activity and the conditions for utilizing the result achieved and arrangements for all forms of cooperation including mutual utilization of infrastructural facilities for youth development through academic, research collaborations and adventure activities, joint expeditions and faculty exchange will be negotiated for each specific case. Both institutions understand that all financial arrangements will be negotiated and identified in an exchange agreement prior to the commencement of the associated activities.

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP focuses on achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goal 4.7 towards education for building peaceful and sustainable societies across the world by developing programmes that promote social-emotional learning, innovate digital pedagogies and empower youth. UNESCO MGIEP is seeking to mobilize partners for the achievement of its strategic goals and programme priorities;

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP, through its Rethinking Youth Programme is building the capacities of youth especially through universities to deliver and receive high quality social-emotional learning (SEL) leveraging the power of online experiential learning on the UNESCO MGIEP FramerSpace online learning platform;

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP in partnership with Life University (USA) has developed the Selfdirected Emotional Learning for Empathy and Kindness (SEEK) online self-directed course based on the Compassionate Integrity Training (CIT) course developed by Life University and hosted on the UNESCO MGIEP GDPR-compliant Framer Space Learning Platform.

Whereas, the Partner, Kurukshetra University was established in 1956, recognized by the UGC, is NAAC accredited ' $A+$ ' university and is focused on preparing a class of proficient scholars and professionals with ingrained human values and commitment to expand the frontiers of knowledge for the advancement of society and be globally acknowledged as a distinguished centre of academic excellence. The Kurukshetra University Centre for Training Internship and Employment (KUCTIE) will be the Nodal Centre to carry forward this partnership agreement

Whereas, the Partner Kurukshetra University would like to provide the Faculty and students skills in social and emotional intelligence and resilience, interpersonal skills, and holistic systems-level thinking.

## Now therefore, the Parties hereby agree as follows Article 1 - Objectives

By the present Agreement, UNESCO MGIEP and the Partner agree, through joint and concerted cooperation:
1.1 For the Partner( KUK) to sign up to1000 Faculty, Staff, Students as a first trial cohort to enrol and obtain completion certification in the UNESCO MGIEP SEEK online course by April 2022;
1.2 For UNESCO MGIEP to deploy a Partner branded instance of the SEEK course providing
free-of-cost access for the agreed first cohort of learners;
1.3 To provide professional thematic and technical support for all enrolled learners;
1.4 To promote the deployment of SEEK through the Partner's key national and international events
1.5 Following the review of the first cohort, the Partner may agree to commit additional Staff and student learners through 2 cohorts of up to 2000 students on voluntarily basis, each annually for a mutually agreed fee of Rs 500 per learner for additional specialised services by UNESCO MGIEP.

## Article 2 - Obligations of the Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra (Party-1)

2.1 The Partner agrees to execute the terms of the present Agreement;
2.2 The Partner may enroll up to 1,000 Faculty Staff and university students for the first trial cohort to enroll and obtain completion certification in SEEK by April 2022;
2.3 The Partner agrees to nominate up to 2-10 Faculty/Staff to undertake further advanced Facilitator Training in order to provide thematic and technical support to future learners from their university;
2.4 The Partner agrees to extensively promote the association with UNESCO MGIEP and the deployment of the SEEK course at key national and international events and relevant stakeholders;
2.5 The Partner may consider including SEEK as an open elective course for building ethical values and $21^{\text {st }}$ century skills for its students and provide a University certification of completion towards acquiring these credits.
2.6 Only after the successful completion and review of the trial cohort, the Partner maycommit to the commercial deployment of SEEK at scale through the offer of anopen elective course offered annually to 2 cohorts of up to 2000 learners on voluntarily basis each for INR 500 per learner.

## Article 3 - Obligations of UNESCO MGIEP (Party -2)

3.1 UNESCO MGIEP agrees to execute the terms of the present Agreement;
3.2 UNESCO MGIEP will implement a Partner-branded instance of the SEEK course on the UNESCO FramerSpace platform.
3.3 UNESCO MGIEP will provide learner support through the online Global SEEK Learner Community public access Masterclasses;
3.4 MGIEP will provide the following additional specialized services:
a. Setup of the Partner Learner Community with dedicated learner support staff;
b. Special Masterclass sessions for the Partner learners;
c. UNESCO MGIEP will provide advanced training opportunities for up to 2-10 selected Faculty Staff to acquire Facilitator-level certification in SEEK;
d. UNESCO MGIEP will extensively promote the association with relevant stakeholders and invite the Partner to key national and international events.
e. Joint Social media promotions for SEEK outreach with the Partner
3.5 UNESCO MGIEP will provide full technical support for the UNESCO MGIEP SEEK course hosted on the UNESCO MGIEP FramerSpace digital learning platform including email support during Indian business hours and an escalation system of MGIEP personnel and set number of hours or days for the resolution of system issues;

## Article 4 - Media activities

4.1 The projects, their conception, their implementation, their development, their impact and their outcome will necessitate informational and promotional activities at the initiative of - and on the part of- the parties, separately or jointly.
4.2 Each party is authorized to use the name, the logo and any element of the other's identity, through the use of citations, references to, reproductions, representations on the occasion of the promotion of projects, of public relations, operations, of interviews, of relations with the media (press files, articles, releases etc.) throughout the world. This use, which must adhere to the image of the concerned party, must receive the prior and written consent by UNESCO MGIEP or KUK when it relates to information activities external to the Partner.
4.3 The media and information support (films, photographic pictures, etc.), as well as all the rights related to them, will belong exclusively to the Party who makes and finances them. They can only be used by the other Party after the latter obtains the prior consent of the proprietary party. Notwithstanding that, the proprietary party can refuse to authorize their use if the rights given up (copyright, trademark) do not cover the foreseen exploitations.

## Article 5 - General Conditions

### 5.1 Use of the Name, Emblem or Official Seal of UNESCO MGIEP

Unless authorized in writing by parties shall not use the name, acronym or official logo of each other, or any abbreviation for advertising or any other purposes.

### 5.2 Status of UNESCO

Supporting the objectives of UNESCO and of the United Nations Organization, the Partner will respect the status of UNESCO as an intergovernmental organization of the United Nations system with its own distinct Constitution. The Partner confirms that it is not directly
involved in the production of goods or the delivery of services, which would be opposed to. the objectives and principles of UNESCO, the United Nations Organization or
institutions of the United Nations system.

### 5.3 Status of the Partner

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as establishing a legal partnership (such as, by way of clarification, partnership liability), joint venture, agency, exclusive arrangement or other similar relationship. Neither the Partner nor anyone whom it may employ shall be considered as an agent of UNESCO MGIEP or a member of the staff of UNESCO MGIEP and, except as otherwise provided herein, shall not be entitled to any privileges, immunities, compensation or reimbursements, nor shall be authorized to commit UNESCO MGIEP to any expenditure or other obligations.

### 5.4 Conformity with Laws

The Partner agrees to respect the laws of the country it is operating in and guarantees that it will not permit any official of UNESCO MGIEP to receive a direct or indirect profit from this Agreement. Furthermore, The Partner certifies and warrants that it has not, nor have its members, been convicted of any crimes and that there are currently no lawsuits or legal actions being taken against it. Should this happen, The Partner undertakes to notify UNESCO MGIEP immediately.

### 5.5 Privileges and Immunities of UNESCO MGIEP

Nothing in or relating to the present Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of any of the privileges and immunities of UNESCO MGIEP. The Partner shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify UNESCO MGIEP against all lawsuits, claims, costs and liabilities resulting from any intellectual property disputes or other disputes occurring under the present Agreement and which arise out of acts or omissions of The Partner.

### 5.6 Assignment

None of the Parties shall assign, transfer, pledge or make other disposition of the present Agreement or any part thereof or of any of their rights, claims or obligations under the present Agreement except with the prior written approval of the other Parties. Any of the aforementioned actions taken without such written approval shall not be valid.

### 5.7 Settlements of Disputes

All disputes arising out of or in connection with the present Agreement shall be settled by mutual understanding. However, if no amicable settlement can be arrived at, any dispute shall be, arbitrated according to the rules defined by UNCITRAL (United Nations Commission on International Trade Law).
5.8.1 Should either Party fail to meet its obligations, the other Party may terminate the present Agreement upon 3 (three) months' written notice to the other Party. The same will apply with respect to incidents making the realization of the Project extremely hazardous. In particular, the Partner may withdraw from the Project and cease all financial contributions if the funds it has contributed have not been directly available to the Project.
5.8.2 Upon the termination of the present Agreement, the Partner shall not use UNESCO MGIEP's name, emblem or official seal, or any abbreviation of the name of UNESCO MGIEP, for promoting the Project or any other purposes.
5.8.3 Upon the termination of the present Agreement, the Partner shall inform all relevant, past, actual or potential partners (including all persons or bodies that have been informed by the Partner of UNESCO MGIEP's participation in the Project(s)), that UNESCO (i) has terminated its Agreement with The Partner, (ii) is no longer participating in the Project(s).
5.9 Amendment

This Agreement, including this provision, may not be waived, modified or changed in any manner except by a written amendment signed by each of the parties hereto.
5.10 Non-Exclusivity

It is understood that this Agreement does not confer the Partner any exclusivity regarding activities such as those covered by this Agreement, and the Partner accepts that UNESCO MGIEP is currently collaborating on similar activities worldwide with other partners.

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Himachal Pradesh Corrugated Box Manufacturers Associations Plot No. 11A, Sector-2, Parwanoo, District Solan, H.P. the Second Party, and represented herein by its Zonal / Divisional Head, Name of Competent Authority / Representative, (hereinafter referred to as "Second Party", company which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors - inoffice, administrators and assigns).
(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party')

WHEREAS:

1) First Party \& Second Party will collaborate to promote effective use of mutual resources for enhanced opportunities for students.
2) The Parties intend to cooperate for Skill Based Training, Education and Research.

## NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS IOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

## CLAUSE 1 CO-OPERATION

1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Institution and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
1.2 First Party and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of First Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching / training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the industry, the Second Party.
1.3 The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU.

## CLAUSE 2 SCOPE OF THE MoU

2.1 The budding graduates from the institutions can play a key role in technological up-gradation, innovation and competitiveness of an industry. Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
2.2 Curriculum Design: Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching / training methodology for better training \& placement of students.

2.3 Industrial Training \& Visits: Industry and Institution interaction will give an insight into the latest developments / requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party to visit its group companies and also involve in Industrial Training Programs for the First Party. The industrial training and exposure provided to students and faculty through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have a smooth transition from academic to working career. The Second Party will provide its Labs / Workshops / Industrial Sites for the hands-on training of the learners enrolled with the First Party.
2.4 Internships and Placement of Students: Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the Internship and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs.
2.5 Research and Development: Both Parties have agreed to carry out the joint research activities in the fields of - Printing and Packaging Technologies.
2.6 Skill Development Programs: Second Party to train the students of First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gaps and make them industry ready.
2.7 Expert Lectures: Second Party to extend the necessary support to deliver expert lectures to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
2.8 Faculty Development Programs: Second Party to train the Faculties of First Party for imparting industrial exposure/ training as per the industrial requirement considering the National Occupational Standards in concerned sector, if available.
2.9 Start ups/Enterpreneurship: The second party will assist/guide the students for setting their own start ups and further will help them to be entrepreneur in their respective areas.
2.10 There is no financial commitment on the part of the Institue of Mass Communication \& Media Technology, Kurukshetra University Kuruksehtra, the First Party, to take up any activity mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

## CLAUSE 3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

## CLAUSE 4 VALIDITY

4.1 This Agreement will be valid initially for a period of 3 years. It can be extended further with mutual consent.
4.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their existing obligations

## CLAUSE 5 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

5.1 It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under this MOU as independent entities, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.

HEREAFTER REFERRED AS THE "KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY", AND ON THE OTHER, THE, PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION OF INDIA, THROUGH THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT REPRESENTED BY ITS SECRETARY PIYUSH KUMAR JAIN, HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "PERI", IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS SET FORTH HEREIN.
DECLARATIONS
FIRST. KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY:

1. That, its legal address is Kurukshetra Haryana - 136119
2. That its participation in the execution of this agreement will be through the Department of Physical Education, Kurukshatra University..

SECOND. Physical Education Foundation of India declares:

1. Is a NGO registered vide Number 4154 on Page No. 48 to 67 on this date $28 / 8 / 2008$ for the promotion of Physical Education \& Sports in India under the Trust Registration Act (Government of Indial with registration Number 4154 on Dated 28 th August 2013.
2. Its aim is to get Indian Healthy Fit and free from Diseases.
3. Mr. Piyush Kumar Jain as Secretary, authorized for the legal work and signing of MOU for the foundation up to 29th August 2025 and its legal residence is located at 7126, KSK, Lower Ground Floor, Ansari Road, Daryaganj, New Delhi- 110002
The Agreement will be governed by the following clauses:
FIRST. PURPOSE. The present agreement aims to encourage and establish a collaboration network to generate knowledge exchange between the two signatory institutions in research, popularization and teaching in the areas of Physical Education, Sport, Recreation and Physical Activity.
SECUIND. SCOPE. For the achievement of the subject of this agreement shall be carried out the following activities:
4. Generate popularization products between the institutions, which benefit the academicprograms that drive this agreement.
5. Promote short and long duration mobility academic exchange of teacher-researchers in teaching presence (face-to-face) or virtual manner: subjects, modules, units or specific topics, according to the possibilities of each academic institution's resource exchange policies.
6. Promote students' academic mobility to study a semester, specific subjects, or to perform social service or professional practice in institutions or companies authorized by the receiving institution.
7. Negotiate for the development of research and the dissemination of the same in international and national organizations.

5 Promote lecturers exchange in academic events programmed by the signatory institutions, as well as, the accomplishment of seminars and training courses, either personally or through videoconferences.
THIRD. WORK PROGRAMMES. The following priority areas of work has been established:
Teaching. The pooling of specialist teachers in presence and/or virtual form of Physical Education, Recreation, Sport and Physical Activities destined to the following topics: theories and currents of PE, didactics, exercise physiology, sports training, disability, gymnastics, theory's game, sports, activities in the natural environment, camps and research seminars.
Research. Four priority lines of research production will be established:

1. Physical Education, Body, Culture and Activity. Senses and culture in India.
2. Teaching Physical Education. Game, gymnastics, physical activity, leisure, recreation, and sport, practices and speeches of the body in physical education.
3. Sport and Society. The Hindu and Mexican citizenship and sport: institutions, social organizations, new sports activities, sports industries, professional sports, media and sports, etc.
4. Education, disability and inclusion. Vocational training, motor skills development, special didactics and outstanding skills.

FOURTH COMMITMENTS OF THE PARTIES. The signatory parties of the present document will collaborate at all times, in accordance with the principles of good faith and effectiveness, to ensure the proper execution of the agreement and to encourage and promote the cultural, scientific, academic and technological development of the academic programs of the signatory institutions.
FIFTH - COMMISSION OF AGREEMENTS. A Monitoring Committee will be created for the implementation, control and monitoring of the activities foreseen in this Agreement; by the Chairperson, Department of Physical Education and Physical Education Foundation of India, Secretary Piyush Jain; both parties will be responsible for the following functions:
n. To plan, promote, monitor and evaluate programs and actions to be undertaken under this Agreement.
x. To establish the internal rules of the Monitoring Committee, in accordance with the Statutes of the signatories.

To create subcommittees that were relevant to the development of the various programs of action.
SIXTH - VALIDITY. This instrument will be valid for three years from the date of its signature. However, the parties may terminate early, for which the interested party shall notify the other party in writing, within thirty days of anticipation, on the understanding that the parties undertake to comply with all the obligations agreed that are pending completion and which are in development.
SEVENTH -MODIFICATIONS. The present Agreement may be amended or supplemented by agreement of the parties provided they are in writing. Modifications or additions oblige signatories from the date of signature, on the understanding that they will have the sole purpose of improving and contributing to the fulfilment of the purpose of this agreement.
EIGHTH - INTERPRETATION. The conditions of this Agreement constitute the entirety of the agreement between the parties, and represent the complete integration and final expression of the agreement between them regarding the matter stated therein.

It is understood that the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding will commence on the day of signature, and will continue thereafter for five years, subject to revision or modification from time to time by mutual agreement. For renewal, the representative from both institutions will discuss the terms at least six months prior to the natural termination of the current Memorandum of Understanding. The conflict of interest, if any, can be decided by the mutual consultations.

It extends this cooperation agreement in place and date indicated below and is signed in duplicate by the legal representatives of the parties concerned in accordance with the content, retaining a copy in each.

The "ICSI" and the "Kurukshetra University" are hereinafter, collectively referred to as the 'PARTIES' and individually as a 'PARTY'.

## WHEREAS:

I. THE INSTITUTE OF COMPANY SECRETARIES OF INDIA (ICSI) is the only recognized professional body in India to develop and regulate the profession of Company Secretaries in India.
II. Kurukshetra University, established by the State Legislature Act XII of 1956, in a premier institution of higher learning in the country is accredited at by NAAC and ranks eight among in State Universities.
III. The Parties have appreciated each other's objectives in promoting Excellence inter alia in common area of interest, imparting knowledge and skills required to operate in the area of Academic, Research and Training and are desirous of putting the broad terms of the intentions into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the areas identified for co-operation and commit to co-operate to the fullest extent by mutual understanding.
IV. Kurukshetra University missions to prepare a class of proficient scholars and professionals with ingrained human values and commitment to expand the frontiers of knowledge for the advancement of society.
V. This MoU is subject to the approval of the respective Statutory Authorities of the parties hereto and subject to changes as may be desired.
VI. The implementation and/or conduct of a programmes, courses or activities as specified in this MOU shall be negotiated and determined mutually by the parties vide separate additional agreement or document to be spged by both

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VII. The autonomy of each party shall not be diminished, nor constraints be imposed on to carry out the MoU.
VIII. The development and implementation of specific forms of cooperation based on this MoU will be separately established/ decided between parties and outlined in executive protocols, specifying the nature of joint activities, financial and other arrangements.

## NOW THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:

IX. Both the Parties have hereto identified the following areas where they agree to mutually cooperate to the fullest extent:
a. Kurukshetra University will accord its necessary recognition to Company Secretary Qualification as equivalent to Post Graduate Degree for the purpose of admission to Ph.D. in Management/ Commerce and allied Programmes at Kurukshetra University, subject to their equivalency by Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi and Statutory bodies, as inforce from time to time.
b. ICSI on its part would facilitate the conduct of Specialised Training Programmes in Kurukshetra University for the Faculty Members, Research Scholars and Students of Kurukshetra University on areas of mutual interest by providing experts on its rolls.
c. Kurukshetra University on its part may nominate ICSI Members for Academic Council or other bodies of Schools / University as it deem appropriate.
d. Kurukshetra University on its part would share the expertise of its Faculty Members as mutually desirable by way of acting as resource persons for Training Programs or workshops organised by ICSI.
e. Jointly organise Workshops, Seminars, Continuing Education and Training programmes and similar Academic Programmes for Practicing Professionals, Corporate Executives \& Faculty Members, Research Scholars and students of Kurukshetra University on themes of Topical and Professional interest on equal surplus/deficit sharing basis.
f. Regular exchange of journals published by the parties hereto on a complimentary basis with liberty to reproduce in each other's publications, such portion or portions, which may be of interest, subject to acknowledging the source

h. Regularly exchange course materials, case studies, research publications and other academic and research inputs.
i. Undertake joint research projects which are mutually beneficial.
j. Reciprocate participation in National and International conferences organised by the parties hereto.
k. Extend help and Co-operation in developing Curriculum of Academic and Continuing Education Programmes, on such terms as may be mutually agreed to including Joint Meeting of Curriculum Development Committees/bodies.

1. Organise programmes jointly for Training of Trainers (ToT) for mutual benefit and advantage.
m. ICSI and Kurukshetra University would work jointly for Teacher Congruence by organising specialised programmes together.
n. Exemptions in University subjects for the students of ICSI in topics such as Corporate Governance if deem appropriate by Kurukshetra University.
o. The ICSI may assist Kurukshetra University in devising up a Governance Code for University or other Systems/Practices as asked by Kurukshetra University from time to time.
p. ICSI at its discretion may co-opt Kurukshetra University Registrar/ Nominee on Managing Committee of ICSI as deem appropriate by Kurukshetra University.

Top three rank holders in the aforesaid examinations shall also be eligible for waiver of Registration Fee while registering for the CS Course in Executive Programme.

## XI. ICSI- Study Centre in the premises of Kurukshetra University:

XII. ICSI Empanelment of faculties/trainer :

The ICSI empanels faculties, resource persons and academician for various training programs, Seminars, Classroom teaching, workshops, review of study material, content development, Research, ToT program etc. The faculties and resource persons of Kurukshetra University may get themselves empanelled with the Institute for imparting such training.
XIII. ICSI Library Scheme for Universities and Institutions.

The ICSI is the premier body in Corporate Governance and research. It has got more than 200 own publications in various areas of corporate Governance, Company laws and Capital market. The ICSI may provide its own publications and also selected books of other publishing house free of cost to the Kurukshetra University for use of the students and members, to be kept in the library of Kurukshetra University as a knowledge sharing platforms.
XIV. Participation in ICSI National and International Seminars and Workshops :

The ICSI is the world largest Institute in Corporate Governance and compliance. Every year more than 500 seminars and workshops are organised across the country. The Students and faculties of Kurukshetra University can participate in those seminars for updation of their knowledge and skills in various academic areas. The senior professors can also be invited for various academic and panel discussions.

## XV. Faculty Development Programmes:

Faculty Development Programmes are an essential component in standardizing the Class room teaching all over the country. These programmes help the teachers in updating them with the student's expectation, Institution's expectation and proper penetration in imparting relevant areas of specialization. The fellow members of the institute could contribute in the faculty development program of the Kurukshetra University in the domain of commerce, Business economics, management and Law.

## XVII. Non Binding Nature of the MoU

Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as creating any contract, partnership,
agency or other legal relationship between the parties. The acts/performance and actions taken by either party in furtherance of their respective activities of operation shall not bind the other except to the extent provided under this MoU. The acts performed and action taken by either party that do not fall under the MoU shall have binding effect on the other to the extent they are reduced to writing and the prior consent of the other party is obtained. Also, the MoU does not restrain or preclude parties from entering into similar MoUs with any other organization during currency or the extended currency of this MoU.
That it is expressly understood \& agreed between the parties to this MoU that the personnel(s) employed or hired or engaged (permanent/ regular/ casual/ contractual/temporarily/daily wager or whatever be the status/name) by the Kurukshetra University directly or indirectly for the performance of the obligations under this MoU, shall not be employee of the ICSI for any purpose and none of such person of Kurukshetra University shall have any right to claim anything against the ICSI and same shall be applicable vice versa to ICSI.

## XVIII. Terms and Termination of the MOU

The MoU shall come into force immediately upon its signing by the parties. The MoU will be in force for an initial period of five (5) years. MoU may be extended further on the mutually agreed terms. Kurukshetra University shall not have any right to claim extension or renewal of contract.
a) This MoU may be terminated by mutual consent of the parties before the aforesaid term of five (5) years.
b) This MoU can also be terminated by either of the parties by giving advance notice of three (3) months period without jeopardizing the ongoing collaborative undertakings.

## XIX. Indemnification:

Each Party shall, at its own expense, defend, indemnify, and hold the other Party harmless for damages, liabilities, claims, losses, costs, demands, suits, actions, and reasonable expenses (including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees and settlement costs) (collectively, "Damages") arising out of or related to any third party suits or claims brought against the indemnified Party (i) arising out of or related to the indemnifying Party's violation of any applicable laws, gross negligence, or willful misconduct, or (ii) arising out of or related to any physical damage property, or personal injury or death, caused by the indemnifying Party or any of its Affiliates, participants, officers, directors, and employees.

The indemnifying party shall be granted immediate and complete control of any claim of indemnity and the indemnified party shall not prejudice the indemnifying party's defence of the claim.

The indemnified party shall give the indemnifying party all reasonable assistance at the expense of the indemnifying party on such claim of indemnity.
XX. Intellectual Property Right

ICSI has intellectual property rights over its trade names, corporate signs, logos, software, proprietary information and know-how which the KU, may come across through this MOU. KU shall recognize ICSI's intellectual property rights for all purposes. Nothing in this Agreement shall confer on KU any right or title in the intellectual property of ICSI.
XX. Force Majeure

The Party shall not be liable for any failure to perform, any of its obligations under this MoU if the performance is prevented, hindered or delayed by a Force Majeure event (defined below) and in such case its obligations shall be suspended for so long as the Force Majeure Event continues. Each party shall promptly inform the other of the existence of a Force Majeure Event and shall consult together to find a mutually acceptable solution.
"Force Majeure Event" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of the Parties concerned, including, without limitation, unavailability of any communication system, sabotage, fire, flood, explosion, acts of God, civil commotion, strikes or industrial action of any kind, riots, insurrection, war or acts of government.


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This MoU constitutes the complete Agreement between the Parties and replace any written or oral Agreement or understanding with respect to the subject matter. Changes, amendments or interpretations of this MoU shall be valid only if they are in writing and signed by both parties, except that each Party may make a change of domicile or change of the name of the person to whom notice shall be sent with prior intimation to other party.

## XXII. Amendments

No change, alteration or modification of this MoU shall be valid, unless in writing and signed by both the Parties hereto.

## XXIII. Representations and Warranties

The Parties represent and warrant that they have relevant authority and permission under the applicable laws/ rules/ notifications or by virtue of the order/ instruction/ directive from the relevant authority to enter into this MoU.

## XXIV. Non Waiver

Failure to exercise by either party of any right under this MOU in one or more instances shall not constitute a waiver of those rights in another instance. Such waiver by one Party of any of the rights established herein shall not be considered as a waiver of another right established herein. A provision or right under this MoU shall not be waived except in writing signed by the party granting the waiver, or varied except in writing signed by both the parties.

## XXV. Severability

If any provision of this MoU is held invalid, unenforceable or illegal for any reason, this MoU will remain otherwise in full force apart from that provision(s) which shall be deemed deleted.

## XXVI. Assignment \& Sub-Letting

Neither party shall assign or sub-let any of its rights and obligations hereunder whether in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the other.

## XXVII. Notices

All notices notifications, request, consents and other communications required or permitted to be given to either party pursuant to this MOU shall be in writing and in English language. Notices shall be given by registered post/email (return receipt requested), facsimile against confirmed answerback or by personal delivery addressed as follows:

The headings used in this MoU are for purposes of convenience only and shall not control the language or meaning of the provision following.
XXIX. Confidentiality

Both Parties agree to treat the contents of this MoU and any valuable information provided, developed, found or acquired in the process or performance of this MoU, as confidential and agree and undertake that the Parties shall not disclose the contents of the same to any third party without the prior consent of the other Party unless such information is required to be disclosed under the applicable law, or in pursuance of the order of a competent court, tribunal or other regulatory authority exercising valid jurisdiction. In such case of disclosure of confidential information, the disclosing party shall promptly notify the other party in writing of such disclosure.
For purposes of this MoU, "Confidential Information" includes information that: (i) is sufficiently secret to derive economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and / or (ii) is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy or confidentiality.

Provided that upon the expiration, cancellation, or termination of this MoU , each party shall, upon the written request of the other party, return or destroy, to the satisfaction of the other Party, all Confidential Information, documents, manuals and other materials specified by the other Party.

## XXX. Governing Law

The MoU shall be interpreted in accordance with and governed by the applicable laws in India.
XXXI. Authority

Each party represents and warrants to the other party that It has the necessary power to enter into and perform its respective obligations under this MOU, all actions, conditions, and things required to be taken, shall be fulfiled and done in order to enablethem to lawfully enter into and

## XXXI. Dispute Resolution

It is hereby agreed by and between the parties that if any controversy, dispute or difference shall arise concerning construction, meaning, violation, termination, validity or nullity including without limitation the scope of any Clause or effect of this MoU or any part thereof, or of the respective rights or
liabilities herein contained, the Parties shall make an attempt first to resolve the same by discussion or mediation. However, if the Parties hereto fail to resolve the controversy, dispute or difference amicably within 7 (seven) days of commencement of discussions, conciliation or mediation, then any Party shall upon expiry of such period of 15 (fifteen) days be entitled to refer such controversy, dispute or difference to be resolved by arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or any statutory modifications on re-enactment thereof as in force. The language to be used in the mediation and in the arbitration shall be English. In any arbitration commenced pursuant to this clause, the sole arbitrator shall be appointed by the mutual consent of the parties as per the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The seat, or legal place, of arbitration shall be New Delhi, India. The cost of the Arbitration proceedings shall be shared equally by both the parties.

## XXXII. Jurisdiction

All disputes arising out of or relating to the MoU shall be deemed to have arisen in New, India and only courts having jurisdiction over New Delhi, India shall determine the same.
XXXII. Notwithstanding the above, the scope of this MOU shall automatically become null and void to the extent it is in violation or in contradiction to the provisions of the concerned Rules and Guidelines of the ICSI.

## Recital Clause

WHEREAS KU wishes to collaborate with FITT for services for the University and its Technology Incubation Centre (hereinafter referred to as KUTIC) for IP management and technology commercialization of the technologies developed by the University faculty members and students, for incubation support and availing the IIT Delhi facilities.

Whereas FITT has set up a new unit-Innovation-Technology Transfer Office (herein after referred to as iTTO) with funding from National Biopharma Mission, BIRAC to cater to institutions, innovators and start ups.

The parties have had preliminary discussions in this matter and have arrived at a consensus. The parties now, have therefore, agreed to record the terms of their consensus in this AGREEMENT.

Now this AGREEMENT witnesses that:

i. Technology Assessment / evaluation
ii. Identification of potential licensee
iii. Preparation of technology briefs
iv. Marketing of technologies through various medium
v. Negotiations and closure of deals
vi. Term sheet preparation
vii. Agreement preparation
viii. Post-Transfer Monitoring
1.3 FITT agrees to offer the below mentioned services to KU Technology Incubation Centre (KUTIC) through i-TTO:
i. IP management from analytical searches, assessment to filing and prosecution, till its grant and maintenance
ii. Technology acquisition and IP in-licensing which includes scouting of technologies of interest to start ups, negotiation, deal closure and execution of agreements
iii. Match making for third party validation and collaborative projects
iv. To identify funding partners, assisting in preparing IP and commercialization sections of grant/funding applications/pitch deck and connecting with relevant contacts
1.4 Both parties agree to the following for incubation support:
i. Advisory services in finalizing financial terms for providing the aforesaid services to clients and also in execution of agreements with the clients;
ii. FITT may advise KUTIC in preparing policies and operational guidelines.
iii. Support in holding startup bootcamps, workshops and promotional events;
iv. May connect with its network of expert mentors for events and handholding activities;
v. Guidance to in-house clients (incubatees) for availing grants from national funding agencies;
vi. Compliance guidance to KUTIC startups with respect to statutory compliances as per Companies Act, 2013;
1.5 Both parties agree that the facilities and equipment available at ITT Delhi can be accessed by KU as per the applicable charges of the IIT Delhi standard rates which are available at https://crf.iitd.ac.in/
1.6 Both parties agree to explore the possibility of jointly offering courses in the field of innovation management, intellectual property, technology transfer and entrepreneurship, and decide the terms and conditions mutually.
1.7 KU agrees to pay FITT for the services as detailed in Annexure 1. However, any use of such services shall be approved by competent authority on case to case basis
1.8 Both the Parties shall be responsible to provide each other with complete, accurate, timely and relevant information and to carry out any other obligations which may arise for the due implementation of this AGREEMENT. In addition, both the Parties shall keep each other informed of any material developments, which may have a bearing on the engagements between the Parties.
1.9 This AGREEMENT shall be deemed to have commenced from the date of signing by both the Parties (the "Effective Date") and will initially be valid for a period of 5 years unless terminated by either party after issuance of an advance written notice of 3 months to the other Party. The AGREEMENT may be renewed after its expiry on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

iii. Reproduce confidential information only as required to perform its obligations under this arrangement.
1.12FITT agrees to keep all information related to Intellectual Property and the Intellectual property of KU confidential and not to use or share with any third party other than purpose of licensing or IP filing.

1.13 In case of any disagreement between the Parties in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly, connected to this AGREEMENT then the same shall be resolved amicably by negotiations and / or conciliation between the Parties.
1.14 All disputes, controversies or claims arising out of or relating to this AGREEMENT including existence or interpretation of any clause hereof, shall be referred to arbitration by a sole arbitrator appointed through mutual consent by the parties in writing. The place of arbitration shall be Delhi and the arbitration shall be governed by the Arbitration \& Conciliation Act, 1996 as amended from time to time.
1.15 Both the parties agree that this AGREEMENT supersedes all the other understandings and proposals.
1.16 Each of the signatories below represents and warrants that he or she is authorized to execute this AGREEMENT on behalf of the party for whom he or she signs, and that no further authority, or execution by any other person for such party is necessary.
1.17 This AGREEMENT is executed in duplicate with each copy being an official version and having equal legal validity.
