

WHEREAS

The parties wish to establish a friendly relationship to promote and accelerate the academic cooperation and have decided to enter into this MOU and agree hereby as per articles given below

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1.1. DEFINITIONS "KUK" means Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
- 1.1.1. "CDBRAS means Centre for Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Studies UNIVERSITIES(S)/CENTRE(S), Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
- 1.1.2. BAPSSRI means BAPS Swaminarayan Research Institute, Swaminarayan Akshardham, Akshardham Setu, Pramukh Swami Maharaj Marg, New Delhi (India) 110092.

1.2. RELATION BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND SCOPE

- 1.2.1. Relations & scope between the both parties decided like impart training, conduct academic programmes, seminars, workshops academic exchang etc. to the students as per the mutual understanding/Agreement.
- 1.2.2. There shall not be any financial liability on the part of the First Party.

1.2.3. MANAGEMENT, GOVERNING LAW & JURISDICTION

1.2.4. As per mutual understanding/ agreement both parties will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two entities and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MOU.

1.2.5. GOVERNING LAW & JURISDICTION

This MOU has been executed in English Language, which shall be the binding and controlling language for all matters related to the meaning of interpretation of this MOU.

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India. Any dispute arising under these terms and conditions shall be subjected to the jurisdiction of the courts of Kurukshetra (Haryana)

1.3. LOCATION

1.3.1. Activities arising under this MOU shall be performed by both the parties from their head offices.

1.4. AUTHORISED REPRESENTATIVES

- 1.4.1. Any action required or permitted to be taken and any document required or permitted to be executed under this MOU may be taken or executed.
- a). On behalf of the First Party, by the Registrar/ competent authority, KUK

b). On behalf of the second Party, by the Head BAPS Swaminarayan Research Institute, Swaminarayan Akshardham New Delhi.

2. MAIN OBJECTIVES OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

- To organize lectures/seminars/workshop/symposiums/declamation contest on various social themes including the life and thoughts of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar as well as on Social Harmony, Women Empowerment Indian Constitution, Atamnirbhar Bharat, Indian knowledge tradition, Bharat Ki Sant Parmmpra, etc.
- To guide and motivate the SC/ST/BC, OBC students from time to time and addresses their grievances.
- To organize talent competitions/Quiz contests for students studying in schools, colleges and departments of university.
- The Center and BAPSSRI will organize social camps in villages to promote the ideology of Sant-Mahatmas for the establishment of social harmony and unity etc.
- To exchange academics Programmes.
- To conduct outreach Programmes

3. COMMENCEMENT, COMPLETION, MODIFICATION AND TERMINATION OF THIS MOU

- 3.1. This MOU shall come into force from the date of signing i.e. 11th May 2023
- 3.2. This MOU shall be effective for a period of Five years, but can be reviewed/renewed/modified(if needed) mutually by both the parties.
- 3.3. This MOU may be modified/amended by mutual written agreement at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party.
- 3.4. The modification/changes shall become part of the MOU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/executed, unless otherwise agreed to.
- 3.5. The MOU may be terminated prematurely by either party with mutual agreement by giving prior notice. Such notification must be given to the other party at least three months in advance from the effective date of termination.
- 3.6. All joint activities not completed at the expiration of termination of the MOU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MOU shall come into force from the date of signing.

4. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Ownership of the intellectual contents shall be with respective Party, Which should not be reproduced/copied, without written permission of concerned Party.

5. ARBITRATION

Both the parties shall use all reasonable endeavors to resolve or settle the disputes through mutual negotiation and discussion in connection with this MOU or the interpretation thereof. Any and all disputes, controversies and conflicts ("Disputes") arising out of this MOU between the parties or arising out of or relating to or in connection with this MOU or the performance or non-performance of the rights and obligations set forth herein or the breach termination, invalidity or interpretation thereof which cannot be settled or resolved amicably shall be referred for arbitration to a suitable committee at Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The arbitral award shall be in writing and shall be final and binding on each party and shall be enforceable in any court of competent jurisdiction. None of the parties shall be entitled to commerce or maintain any action in a court of law upon any Dispute arising out of or relating to or in connection with this MOU.

CONSEQUENCE OF BREACH AND PENALTIES

6.1. It shall be obligatory on part of either party to ensure timely assessment and facilitation as per the pre-approved work plan as agreed upon in the MOU.

6.2. In the event of breach of any term or conditions of this agreement, either party


shall have the right to terminate the agreement (notice period).

European Qualification Framework	The European Qualifications Framework for lifelong learning (EQF) provides a common reference framework which assists in comparing the national qualifications systems, frameworks and their levels. It serves as a translation device to make qualifications more readable and understandable across different countries and systems in Europe, and thus promote lifelong and life-wide learning, and the mobility of European citizens whether for studying or working abroad. In order to make the EQF work, European countries participating in "Education and Training 2020" should relate their national qualifications levels to the appropriate levels of the EQF and to indicate in all new qualification certificates, diplomas and Europass documents the relevant EQF level. The core of the EQF consists of eight reference levels describing what a learner knows, understands and is able to do — i.e. "learning outcomes". Levels of national qualifications will be based on one of the central reference levels, ranging from basic (Level 1) to advanced (Level 8). The National Education Policy 1986 aimed to promote national progress, sense of common citizenship and culture and to strengthen national development. Although there is no structured outline of the qualification framework in the system, it lays down the descriptions in the definition of each layer.

Primary school:

Child centered and activity based process of learning to be adopted at primary stage. Children encouraged to undertake rediscovery of India, each with its own image and perception.

Upper primary school:

The common core will include history of India's freedom, constitutional obligations and other content essential to national identity. The component of cognitive learning will be increased and skills organized through practice. Highest priority to solve children dropping out of school coordinated through network of non-formal education.

High school:

Secondary education begins to expose students to the differentiated roles of science, the humanities and social sciences. Access to secondary education will be widened with emphasis on enrolment of girls and backward communities particularly in science, commerce and vocational streams.

Higher secondary/ Intermediate/ PreUnivercity/ Senior Secondary school: supervision with some autonomy

LEVEL 3

Learning outcomes relevant to Level 3:

 KNOWLEDGE: knowledge of facts, principles, processes and general concepts in a field of work or study

 SKILLS: a range of cognitive and practical skills required to accomplish tasks and solve problems by selecting and applying basic methods, tools, materials and information

 COMPETENCE: take responsibility for completion of tasks in work or study; adapt own behaviour to circumstances in solving problems

LEVEL 4

Learning outcomes relevant to Level 4:

- KNOWLEDGE: broad range of factual and theoretical knowledge in a field of work or study
- SKILLS: a range of cognitive and practical skills required to generate solutions to specific problems in a field of work or study
- COMPETENCE: exercise self-management within the guidelines of work or study contexts that are usually predictable, but are subject to change; supervise the routine work of others, taking some responsibility for the evaluation and improvement of work or study activities

LEVEL 5

Learning outcomes relevant to Level 5:

Efforts to develop basic understadning of theory and practice which can help in creating first level of employment OR become the foundation for the higer education. The pratical work offers real learning. This level provides computer literacy to equip children with necessary computer skills to be effective in emerging technological world.

Non technical diploma or certificate not equal to degree:

This level provides basic theoretical knowledge and requisite skills required for field of work. This equips participants with requisite practical knowledge and skills to be applied for the work for producing products and services and offering creative solutions to problems of work.

Technical diploma or certificate not equal to degree: Technical vocational education provides basic theoretical knowledge and requisite skills required for field of work. This equips with practical knowledge and skills which can be used to carry out the work using basic and simple tools and equipment for producing and repairing products.

Under Graduate level:

This level is basic training on the theoretical concepts and principles. The training also demands field work for experiential learning to enhance the connect of knowledge and practice. This should address to develop a particular competency and skill for dealing to the critical problems in the employment or to follow it to higher degree in next level education. It is important to develop the sense of responsibility, project management, group management skills, decision

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 KNOWLEDGE: comprehensive, specialised, factual and theoretical knowledge within a field of work or study and an awareness of the boundaries of that knowledge

 SKILLS: a comprehensive range of cognitive and practical skills required to develop creative solutions to abstract problems

 COMPETENCE: exercise management and supervision in contexts of work or study activities where there is unpredictable change; review and develop performance of self and others

LEVEL 6

Learning outcomes relevant to Level 6:

 KNOWLEDGE: advanced knowledge of a field of work or study, involving a critical understanding of theories and principles

 SKILLS: advanced skills, demonstrating mastery and innovation, required to solve complex and unpredictable problems in a specialised field of work or study

 COMPETENCE: manage complex technical or professional activities or projects, taking responsibility for decision-making in unpredictable work or study contexts; take responsibility for managing professional development of individuals and groups

BACHELOR level

LEVEL 7

Learning outcomes relevant to Level 7:

KNOWLEDGE: highly specialised knowledge, some of which is at the forefront of knowledge in a field of work or study, as

making and ability to handle complex situations.

Post Graduate level:

This level is specialized field of training on knowledge and competency. The candidate should be able to development new frames from the pursued knowledge domain, create new knowledge, ability to integrate and apply knowledge of different fields, and develop special skills to handle critical situations in the employment, entrepreneurship or life. This level promotes entrepreneurship and innovation in every field for creating new opportunities.

Doctoral and Post doctoral:

Highly specialized domain working and new knowledge creation in this level. It is based on research and ability to high order of cognitive working. The special treatment to knowledge framework for life long solutions, critical thinking on new issues and developing new fields of study are specific working of this level. The field demonstrate an authority on field specific knowledge and creates next level in the domain.

Seneral Policy Document for providing exemptions in attendance to students undertaking various internships/ trainings during their final/penultimate semester

Provisions

Students covered as per section title 'Applicability of the Policy' will be governed by the following provisions:

- (a) The student will be allowed to join the organization for internship/training in the final semester/penultimate semester of the course for a period of upto one semester.
- (b) The student will earn his attendance from the organization during the period of internship.
- (c) Attendance will be certified by the organization failing which student will be debarred from appearing in the university examinations of that semester.
- (d) The student will have to give an undertaking that he/she will appear in all the internal/external examinations/practical as per requirements of the program and as per schedule of the University examinations for that program for which he/she will have to do the necessary preparation by himself/herself and institute/department will not be responsible for the same.

Composition of Internship Facilitation Committee (IFC)

The members of IFC will be as under:

- 1. Dean Academic Affairs
- 2. Dean of the concerned faculty
- 3. Chairperson/Director/Head of the concerned department
- Senior most faculty of the department other than Chairperson/Director/Head of the department or the Placement Incharge of Department/ Institute /College

Any offer by the organisations providing internship on demanding charges from a student will be discouraged by the Internship Facilitation Committee (IFC).

General Policy Document for providing exemptions in attendance to students undertaking various internships/ trainings during their final/penultimate semester

Background

Kurukshetra University in its move to improve the employability of the students has taken an unique initiative of introducing technical skills development training programmes. For executing this, a number of MOUs with the industries has been signed. Under this initiative students will be trained by the industry for acquiring various skills to meet their needs for employability. However, at present in the programs run by the university there is no provision for the students to join the industry for such internship/training for more than 4 to 6 weeks duration. To facilitate university students for joining such internships/trainings there arises a need for framing a policy document.

Challenges

It has been realized that the programs running are facing challenges as under:

- (a) Students selected in industry during their program are asked to join the industry for internship/training of duration upto one semester.
- (b) The provision is not there in these programs to allow the students to join the internship by way of getting the required attendance of semester from internship/training.
- (c) So, students are not able to join such internship/training consequential to two-fold loss:
 - (i) Job opportunity
 - (ii) Skill development in industry environment.

Keeping in view the above challenges and to avoid hardship to students, following policy is resolved:

Applicability of the policy:

(a) The policy is applicable to the students studying in the final semester/ penultimate semester of their program.

AND

Minutes of the meeting of the Standing Ordinance Committee held 08.06.2023 at 3.00 P.M in the office of the Dean Academic Affairs to consider/examine the issue regarding declaration of the result of Shastri Part-I examination and to promote the students to Shastri Part-II examinations as regular students on the request submitted by the Principal, Sanatan Dharm Adarsh Sanskrit College (Lahore), Ambala Cantt.

- Assistant Registrar (Academic). 4. (Dean Indic Studies could not attend the meeting)

At the outset the Committee perused the request submitted by the Principal, Sanatan Dharm Adarsh Sankrit College (Lahore) vide which it was stated that Visharada, Shastri and Acharya Courses are being run on regular mode in their college. The students who have failed in more than one papers have been declared as fail and also not been promoted to 2nd year whereas the regular students who have failed in two papers are being promoted to 2nd year. It was further added that due to late declaration of the result of the Shastri-I examination by the examination branch of the university, they have promoted the students in Shastri Part-II examination and have requested to consider/approve the above action taken by their college for the sake of benefit of the students and also further requested to promote the students as regular candidates in other courses running on regular basis.

The Committee perused the Ordinance for Oriental Title in Sanskrit Language and Literature Examination appearing in K.U. Calendar Volume-II, 2014 (Part A) and observed that the Visharada, Shastri and Acharya course is running under Annual System and the result of the candidates for above said courses have been declared as per Ordinance. The students who have failed in more than one paper for Shastri-I examination, are not eligible for promotion to Shastri Part- II examinations as per Clause 12(b) of the Ordinance, which is re-produced below :-

For Shastri:

" A candidate who has failed in one paper only obtaining not less than 40% marks in the total of the remaining papers in which he/she has already passed, shall be permitted to appear at the Supplementary examination to be held in the same year and/or at the next Annual Examination in that paper only, on payment of the same fee, on each occasion, as for the whole examination, and if he/she passes in that paper in either of these examinations, he/she shall, if he/she has also obtained the aggregate marks prescribed in Clause 11 above, be deemed to have passed the examination. If he/she fails to pass or fails to appear in both these examinations, he/she shall have to appear in all the subjects/papers de novo".

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The Controller of Examinations informed to the Committee that the result for Shastri Part-I examination has been declared late due to some technical issues of the IUMS portal. It was also informed that recently, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has approved the recommendations of the Advisory Committee of the Directorate of Distance Education in its meeting held on 27.12.2022 U/S 11(5) of K.U. Act & Statutes, 1986 in anticipation of approval of the Academic Council vide which students of Distance Education in all the UG Programmes being eligible, who have either not appeared or appeared in any semester/annual examination and failed in one or more subjects for that examinations, he/she can appear for such subject(s) at subsequent examinations without attending a fresh course of studies for that semester/year in the Directorate from session January, 2023 onwards by implementing the Clause 8.1(regarding promotion) of the Ordinance for B.A./B.Sc.(General and Hons.) (Semester system) Examination appearing in K.U. Calendar Volume-I, 2014 (Annexure....) for the students seeking admission in the Directorate.

The Committee also perused request dated 12.06.2023 submitted by the Principal, Sanatan Dharm Adarsh Sanskrit College (Lahore), Ambala Cantt. vide which it was requested to allow promotion to the students of Shastri Part-I to Shastri Part-II Examination like regular students and also to allow to issue admit card to the students for appearing in the examination which are to be held from 16.06.2023. It was also mentioned therein that except above, the matter of promotion has no concern with other courses e.g. Visharda and Aacharya as from the next session the said courses will come under the jurisdiction of Central Sanskrit University, Delhi.

In view of the above facts and records, the Committee unanimously recommends as under:

- 1. The students of Shastri Part-I examination being eligible, who have either not appeared or appeared in annual examination and failed in one or more subjects for that examinations, he/she can appear for such subject(s) at subsequent examinations without attending a fresh course of studies examination. Such students may also be considered to be promoted to the next year on the same pattern as already approved by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for the candidates of Distance Education.
- The latest clauses of the Ordinance for Shastri Examination may be got amended in the accordance with that for Distance Education as per Annexure-I.

3. The concerned College may be informed accordingly.

If he/she fails to pass or fails to

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appear at both these examinations, he/she shall have to appear in all the papers de novo.

Provided that the Academic Council may extend this period in the case of a member of the regular Armed Forces, who is unable, owing to the Defence exigencies, to avail himself/herself of a chance within this time.

Provided further that the candidate placed in the categories of (a) & (b) above may be allowed to read for the next higher class and to clear the paper in two consecutive chances but if he/she fails to pass or fails to appear in the paper at the second chance, his/her result for the higher examination shall, unless he/she has passed in that examination, be cancelled and he/she shall not be allowed to appear for the same till he/she has passed in the lower examination. The meeting started by welcoming of all the members by Chairperson and the staff council recommended the suggestions for improvement in eligibility criteria for the session 2023-24 for M. Sc. Home Science (Food Nutrition and Dietetics) and M. Sc. Home Science (Human Development). The members are of view that

- 1. In recent years many new under graduate specialized courses related to Food, Nutrition & Dietetics and Human
- Development have been introduced by various Universities and also the nomenclature of B.Sc. Home Science has been reframed and modified as B.Sc. Community Science/B.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics so on.
- 2. In the last 2-3 years, students from different related courses have been approaching to pursue the P.G. courses in the Department of Home Science, KUK.
- 3. Keeping in view the multidisciplinary approach of NEP-2020, the eligibility criteria has been widened to accommodate students from other related/specialized multidisciplinary streams. Hence, the staff council recommended the changes in the eligibility conditions for the said courses.

M. Sc. Home Science (Food Nutrition and Dietetics) (2 Year):

Eligibility Condition: Candidate who has passed one of the following examinations with any field of specialization, obtaining atleast 50% marks in aggregate:

After detailed deliberations, the Committee suggested necessary amendments/additions in the Ordinance (s) supplied by the concerned Department and observed that all the necessary provisions have been incorporated in the new Ordinance as per Annexure-I and the same is in order. Accordingly, the Committee unanimously recommends that the above draft Ordinance be put up to the higher authority for consideration and approval.

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ORDINANCE—DIPLOMA IN SANSKRIT LANGUAGE (Semester System) under Credit Based System (CBS) (w.e.f. the session 2022-23)

- 1. This Ordinance is based on National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and will be effective from the session 2022-23.
- 2. The duration of the programme leading to award of Diploma in Sanskrit Language shall be one year consisting of two semesters.
- 3. The examination shall be held twice in an academic session ordinarily in the month of December and May next year in the online/physical mode as decided by the Staff Council of the concerned Department/availability of teaching faculty/instructions imparted by the Controller of the examinations from time to time. The dates fixed under this clause shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 4. There shall be actual teaching for a minimum of 13-15 weeks (90 days) in each semester excluding admission, preparation and examination days. Teaching & Learning will be held in the Physical/Online mode.

Eligibility for admission

- 5. A person who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of the Board of Scholl Education Haryana or an equivalent examination i.e.shall be eligible for the course.
- 6. A person of any age whether in job can also take admission to this course, if otherwise eligible. To take admission in this course, Migration Certificate is not required.

Eligibility for appearing in the examination

- 7. A candidate who possesses the qualifications laid down in Clause 5 above, has been on the rolls of the Department/recognized College for the course during the academic year preceding the examination, and produces the following certificates signed by the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of College concerned, shall be eligible to appear in the examination:
 - (b) of good character;
 - (b) of having attended not less than 75% of the full course of lectures (the course to be counted up to the day before the commencement of the examination).
- (i) A deficiency in the prescribed lectures may be condoned by the chairperson of the Department up to 15% in each paper on valid grounds.
 - (ii) These shall also include loss of attendance due to participation in the cultural and sports assignments etc. Provided that a student who participates in the Inter-university Tournaments/Youth festivals may be allowed additional condonation on this ground upto 10% in each paper on a certificate from the Director, Physical Education & Sports or the Director, Youth and Cultural Affairs Department, as the case may be, subject to the condition that such a student shall not be allowed to appear in the examination if his/her attendance, after condonation on all counts, falls below 50%.
- 10. A student who has completed the prescribed course, but does not appear in the examination, or, having appeared in the examination, has failed, may be allowed to appear in the examination as an ex-student for three consecutive years without attending a fresh course of instruction, on payment on each occasion, of the same fee as prescribed in Clause 1.1 below.

- 11. The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate shall be the same as prescribed by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
- 12. The examination shall be held according to the syllabus prescribed by the Academic Council. A candidate who fails in an examination, or, having been eligible, fails to appear in an examination, shall, unless otherwise approved otherwise by the Academic Council, take the examination as an ex-student according to the syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students appearing for that examination.
- 13. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English and Japanese.
- 14. The minimum percentage/grade of marks to pass the examination in each semester shall be Grade P in each theory paper.
- 15. While re-appearing in the examination the candidate shall be exempted from appearing in paper(s) and/or practical(s) in which he/she has obtained at least Grade P.
- 16. The Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the examination four weeks after the termination of the examination or as soon thereafter as is possible.
- 17. The grade and the corresponding grade point will be awarded to a candidate on the basis of absolute marks taken by him in all the papers/practicals as under. The conversion factor for conversion from SGPA/CGPA to percentage of marks shall be 10.

Dr. Anita Dua, Prof. Dept. of IIHS (member of the Core Committee) presented the Curriculum and Credit Framework Template for Under Graduate Programmes as per National Education Policy 2020 (Multiple Entry-Exit, Internship and Choice Based Credit System) framed by the Central Committee of NEP Coordinators of the State Universities and Curriculum Credit Framework of Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra for Under Graduate Programmes as per NEP 2020 for implementation in UG Programmes in departments/colleges/institutes affiliated to Kurukshetra University, designed by NEP Core Committee. Copies of the Curriculum Credit Framework were also provided to all the members present in the meeting.

Doubts and queries raised by Deans, Chairpersons, Directors, Principals & concerned teachers regarding the template were addressed by the Dean Academic Affairs.

In the meeting the following were resolved:

 Members present in the meeting recommended the Curriculum and Credit Framework for UG Programmes as per NEP 2020, based on the common Curriculum Framework for UG Programmes for State Universities, and framed by the NEP Core Committee of KUK alongwith the pools of VOC, VAC, AEC, SEC courses as passed.

- 2. All Chairpersons/Directors will prepare the Schemes/Syllabi according to discussed Framework within next 15 days. Firstly, the syllabi of first 4 Semesters will be framed but the Schemes will be drawn for the whole programmes.
- 3. As per latest UGC guidelines, the C.O. will be termed as C.L.O and P.O will be termed as P.L.O. The details about P.L.Os will be chalked out by the Director, IQAC.
- 4. While preparing the Syllabi, the reference of local, regional, national and global needs may be considered in designing CLOs & PLOs.
- All the Deans & Chairpersons authorized the NEP Core Committee of the University to make changes in the Framework and pools of VOC, VAC, SEC, AEC, etc. if required so.

At the end, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor addressed all the members present in the meeting and stated that Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra is the first University in Haryana that has successfully implemented the NEP 2020 on campus in Under Graduate courses w.e.f. the session 2022-23 and is going to implement it in all the affiliated colleges w.e.f. the session 2023-24. He has emphasized that the process of implementation of NEP 2020 is new, so it is going to be challenging as the guidelines issued by the D.H.E. and U.G.C. may change time to time as per the requirement. This is an evolving and dynamic process and framework, scheme, courses, pools of courses will get modified accordingly. He showered appreciation on the members of the Core Committee for their rigorous efforts made regarding implementation the NEP 2020. He has also stated that all Chairpersons/Directors should prepare the Schemes/Syllabi according to discussed Framework within next 15 days as the admissions for the academic session 2023-24 are to be made as per NEP 2020.

5. A student will opt for AEC, SEC, VAC and Minor (Vocational) courses from the respective pools of courses offered by the Department/College/Institute duly approved by the University. A Department/College/Institute can add more courses in the pools of AEC, SEC, VAC and VOC courses with prior approval of the university.

6. For first and second semester of UG programme (Interdisciplinary) (Scheme D), a student can choose a Minor Course of 2 credit and From 3rd semester onwards a student can choose a Minor Course of 4 credit from the pool of minor subjects offered by the

Department/College/Institute in that semester.

- 7. In the subjects/courses which involve practicum, i.e. Practical/ Laboratory/ Studio/ Project/ Survey/Field work, etc., a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and one credit for practicum and in other subjects/courses, a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial. During 4th year, when the practicum course is offered as a separate course in that subject, then a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial.
- 8. In case of AEC of 2 credits, the entire 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures.

9. In the SEC courses of 3-credits, 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum and in the DSEC courses of 4 credits, 3 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum.

10. If a student takes exit after the second semester, then Undergraduate Certificate in Discipline will be awarded after earning 52 credits including 4

credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation.

11. If a student takes exit after the 4th semester, then Undergraduate Diploma in Discipline will be awarded after earning 96 credits including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation.

Session 2020-21)(ii) Diploma in Hospitality and Event Management (LOCF-CBCS) (w.e.f. Session 2022-23) under NEP.

The Committee perused the draft Ordinance (s) for (i) Bachelor of Hotel Management & Catering Technology (BHM&CT) (under CBCS) (ii) Diploma in Hospitality and Event Management (LOCF-CBCS) under NEP duly approved by the P.G. After detailed deliberations, the Committee suggested necessary amendments/additions in the Ordinance (s) supplied by the concerned Department and observed that all the necessary provisions have been incorporated in the new Ordinance(s) as per Annexure-I&II and the same are in order. Accordingly, the Committee unanimously recommends that the above draft Ordinance (s) be put up to the higher authority for consideration and approval.

ORDINANCE—BACHELOR OF HOTEL MANAGEMENT & CATERING TECHNOLOGY (BHM&CT (CBCS-LOCF) EXAMINATION (Under 10+2+4 Scheme) (Semester System) w.e.f. Session 2020-2021

- 1.1 The duration of the course of instruction for the award of Bachelor of Hotel Management & Catering Technology (BHM&CT) Degree shall be four academic years, comprising of eight semesters. Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters i.e. July to December and January to May/June.
- 1.2 Main as well as supplementary examinations for the First, Third, Fifth and Seventh semesters shall be held in December/January and for the Second, Fourth, Sixth and Eighth semesters in May/June.
- 1.3 The dates of examination fixed under above clause shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations to all concerned.
- 2. The last date(s) by which Examination-forms and fees must reach the Examination Enquiry shall be as per schedule at Appendix-I in K.U. Cal. Vol.II.
- 3.1 A candidate shall be eligible to join the First Semester of Bachelor of Hotel Management and Catering Technology Course, if he has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of Board of School Education, Haryana or of any other Board/Institution recognized as equivalent thereto by the University.
- 3.2 A candidate who has passed 3-year Diploma in Hotel Management & Catering Technology after 10+2 examination, with at least 50% marks in aggregate from the State Board of Technical Education or Board recognized as equivalent thereto by the Kurukshetra University shall be allowed to join the Fifth semester of the course under lateral entry system.
- 4. A person who has passed the semester I and II or III and IV or V and VI shall be eligible to join the semester III, V and VII respectively of the course. This is, however, subject to the provisions made Clause 8.
- 5. Every candidate shall be examined according to the scheme of examination and syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. A candidate, who fails in an examination, or, having been eligible fails to appear in an examination, shall, unless approved otherwise by the Academic Council, take the examination according to the syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students appearing for that examination.
- 6.1 The courses of study and the subjects of examinations shall be as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. The examination shall consist of:
 - (a) Written Papers: Written papers to be set by the Paper-setters duly recommended by the concerned Board of Studies. If question paper is not received two weeks before the commencement of the examination, it will be got set from another Paper-setter duly recommended by the Chairperson concerned. The Answer-books will be evaluated by the examiners duly recommended by the Board of Studies.
 - (b) **Practical Examinations:** Examinations in Practicals/ viva-voce shall be conducted by the Examiners duly recommended by the concerned Board of Studies.
 - (c) Sessionals: Each theory paper in each semester shall have 30% marks for Internal Assessment/Sessional Work. The internal Assessment/Sessional Work shall be evaluated by the teachers concerned on the basis of following activities:
 - (i) Class test (Two of 10 marks each) 20 marks

(ii) Class Attendance

3 marks

(iii) Class Work/Participation

3 marks

(iv) Assignment

4 marks

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- 6.2 Attendance to the extent of 10% for the award of Sessional marks can be given on account of:
 - (i) participation in sports/games/cultural activities etc. certified by the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the College concerned.
 - (ii) taking a competitive examination/appearing in interviews held by Govt. Organizations/public Ltd. Companies subject to the satisfaction of the Department/College.
- 6.3 The Chairperson/Director/Principal of the Department/Institute shall forward the soft as well as hard copies of the final awards of the internal assessment based on minor test (best two out of three) and co-curricular activities (assignments, attendance, viva-voce, lab. work, seminar, workshop, presentation, group discussions, quiz etc.) of the students to the Examination Branch.
- 6.4 The Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the College shall preserve the record on the basis of which the Internal Assessment/ Sessional awards have been prepared, for inspection if needed by the University up to six months from the date of declaration of the Semester result.
- 7.1 The First/Second/Third/Fourth/Fifth/Sixth/Seventh/Eighth Semester examinations shall be open to a regular student who has :
 - a) passed the requisite qualifying examinations as laid down in Clause 3, or is covered under clause 4 or 8;
 - b) remained on the rolls of the Department/College during one semester preceding the examination; and
 - c) his/her Examination form submitted to the Examinations Branch through the Chairperson of the Department/ Principal of the College concerned and produces the following certificates:
 - a. of good character;
 - b. of having attended not less than 75% of the full course of lectures delivered in each paper and practical separately in each semester (the course to be counted up to the day before the commencement of the examination).

Provided that a candidate who has not attended the requisite percentage of lectures will be detained by the Department/Institute to take Major Test in the concerned paper unless he/she repeats the course in the paper(s) concerned and obtains requisite attendance.

- 7.2 The Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the College concerned may condone deficiency in the prescribed course upto 10% of lectures delivered in each paper on the sufficient grounds.
- 8.1 If a candidate has, after attending the course of studies in the Department/College and being eligible, either not appeared or appeared in any semester examination and failed in one or more subjects for that examination, he can appear for such subject(s) at subsequent examinations without attending a fresh course of studies for that semester in the college. Such a candidate may in the meantime, pursue his studies for the next higher semester(s) and appear in the examination(s) for the same alongwith the examination for the lower semester(s), as an ex-student only twice on the recommendation of the Principal of the College concerned. While re-appearing in the examination, the candidate shall be exempted from appearing in the paper(s)/practical(s) in which he/she has obtained pass marks.

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Provided that after completion of their regular studies for the whole duration of the course upto 8th semester, the candidate will be allowed to appear in examination as an ex-student for the reappear/left out papers under the permissible chances, within the prescribed time.

- 8.2 A candidate who fails to pass all the examination (First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh & Eighth semesters) within eight years of his admission to the course, shall be required to repeat the course de novo.
- The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each semester shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time. A candidate, who re-appears in one or more paper(s)/practical(s)/ semester(s) for the purpose of passing, shall pay fees as for the whole examination.
- The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
- 11. The minimum percentage/grade of marks to pass the examination in each Semester shall be:
 - (i) Grade 'P' in each Major Test:
 - (ii) Grade 'P' in each practical examination or Dissertation or Project Report/Training Report/Field Work or Viva-voce etc., where prescribed;
 - (iii) Grade 'P' in the aggregate of Minor and Major Tests for each theory/practical paper.
- 11.1 While re-appearing in the examination the candidate shall be exempted from appearing in paper(s) and/or practical(s)/Project/Training/Field Work in which he/she has obtained at least Grade 'P' including Minor Test Grade, as indicated in (i), (ii) and (iii) above. Such a candidate will not be required to re-appear in Minor Test.
- 12. Unless otherwise provided in the Ordinance for relevant examination, the minimum Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) required for the continuation of registration and the award of degree is 4.00.
- 13. Award of grades and the corresponding grade points should be based on Absolute marks as under. The conversion factor for conversion from SGPA/CGPA to percentage of marks shall be 10.

Note: A candidate eligible to take the examination obtaining Grade F or Ab will (1)be considered to have failed in the examination/paper(s). Such a candidate will be required to re-appear in that examination/paper(s) within the permissible chances given in the concerned Ordinance for obtaining pass grade.

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If 'F'/'Ab' Grade is awarded to a candidate in major project, he/she will get only one more chance to repeat the project work at the end of next (2)Semester. However, if a candidate still gets 'F'/'Ab' Grade in major project, the same will not be eligible for the award of degree.

For non-credit courses 'Satisfactory' or 'Unsatisfactory' shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of (3)SGPA/CGPA.

- 14. The BHMCT course shall comprise two industrial trainings for on the job learning.
 - 6 Months Hotel Industrial Training (20 22 weeks) (in 5th semester) and
 - 20-22 weeks On-the-job training (in 8th semester)

A Training /Dissertation report with valid training certificate along with handwritten logbook would have to be submitted within twenty days after the of completion of training. In case of delay in submission, permission would be required as per University rules.

The evaluation of the training will be done on the basis of report submitted /viva voce and is to be conducted jointly by external an internal examiner. The examinations shall be approved by the U.G. Board of Studies. The training and report viva voce will be of 20 credits & of 500 marks in both the 5th semester and 8th semester. If a candidate fails to submit the training report up to the extended period, he/she shall be considered to have absented in the training evaluation and his/her result be declared accordingly.

Guidelines for Awarding Degree (s)

An undergraduate degree in Bachelors in Hotel Management & Catering Technology Programme (BHMCT Programme) under Learning Outcome Based Curriculum & Choice based credit system (LOCF/CBCS) will be awarded if the student complete 22 Core courses / papers in the discipline + 2 AECC courses + 6 SEC courses + 8 DSE courses / papers.

- As soon as possible, after the termination of the examination, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of candidates. The Detailed-Marks-Cards will be issued by the Result Branch.
- The above Ordinance may be amended from time to time as and when required by the 17. University. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of the BHMCT (LOCF / CBCS) Course which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins a course, shall hold good only for the examination(s) held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance subsequently and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all students whether old or new.

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ORDINANCE

POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN HOSPITALITY AND EVENT MANAGEMENT (PGDHEM) (SEMESTER SYSTEM)

UNDER LEARNING OUTCOME BASED CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK- CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (LOCF-CBCS) AND MULTIPLE ENTRY-EXIT FORMAT

(w. e. f. Session 2022-23)

This Ordinance is based on National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and will be effective from the Academic Session 2022-2023.

- The duration of the Level 8 programme for the award of degree of Post Graduate Diploma in Hospitality and Event Management (PGDHEM) shall be one academic year. The year shall be divided into two semesters i.e., July to November/December and January to April/May.
- There shall be actual teaching for a minimum of 13-15 weeks (90 days) in each 1.2 Semester excluding admission, preparation and examination days.

- 2.1 Academic Year and Semester: One academic year constitutes of (one odd and one even) semester. A semester will consist of 13-15 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days.
- 2.2 Credit: One credit means one hour of theory or one hour of tutorial or two hours of laboratory work per week for the duration of a semester (13-15 weeks). 1 Credit will carry 25 marks.
- 2.3 Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF): The learning outcomes of the programme are mapped against well-defined outcomes of its Courses.
- 2.4 Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS): The CBCS provides choices to students to select Interdisciplinary courses to fit their own requirements and learn at their own pace
- 2.5 Programme: This programme leads to the award of Post Graduate Diploma.
- 2.6 Course: 'Course' refers to the components of a programme. Course is a component of a programme and may include theory, Practicals, seminars, internships etc. A course may be designed to comprise taught course/ lectures / tutorials/laboratory work/field work/outreach activities/project work/vocational training/seminars/ internship/ map work etc. or any combination of these.

All courses need not carry the same weightage. Courses can be;

- 2.6.1. Core Course: A compulsorily course of a programme aimed to cover the basics of a particular discipline/subject.
- 2.6.2 Elective Course: A course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study. It aims at providing an extended scope or exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain and nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skills.

2.6.3 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective course offered for enhanced knowledge and skills in the major/minor specializations.

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2.6.4 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course from an unrelated discipline/subject for development of wider perspective.

A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as Generic elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives be referred to as Generic Elective.

- 2.6.5 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses are of two kinds:
- (i) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement.
- (ii) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
- 2.6.6. **Seminar:** A course requiring students to participate in structured discussion/conversation or debate focused on assigned tasks/readings, current or historical events, or shared experiences guided or led by an expert or qualified personnel in a field of learning, work/vocation or professional practice.
- 2.6.7 **Internship:** A course requiring students to participate in professional employment-related activity or work experience normally under the supervision of an employee of the training organization. A key aspect of the internship is induction into actual formal and organized work situations. Internships involves working with local industry, businesses, artists, crafts persons, educational institutions etc. for practical This will be guided learning by the faculty to mentor and monitor the progress.
- 2.6.8 Activity courses (30 hours in semester)
- (i). Workshop-based activities: Courses involving workshop-based activities requiring engagement of students in hands-on activities related to work/vocation or professional practice.
- (ii). Community engagement and service: Courses requiring students to participate in field-based learning/project generally under the supervision of a faculty to expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems.
- 2.6.9 Guided learning/Research Ability Enhancement Courses
- (i). Project work/Field project/ field survey/ internship/ industrial training is considered as a special course requiring students to participate in field-based learning/project, involving application of knowledge in solving/analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Field project/ field survey work of 4-8 credits.
- 2.7 Key Terms related to evaluation
- 2.7.1 Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- 2.7.2 Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- 2.7.3 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the decimal place

2.7.4 Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F

- 2.7.5 **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)**: It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- 2.7.6 **Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate:** Based on the grades earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC): Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is a virtual/digital storehouse of academic credit data base of registered HEIs for credit accumulation, credit verification, credit transfers or redemption of credits. Each student will have to open an Academic Bank of Credits through the department concerned. At the end of each semester credits earned by the student will be uploaded in his/her respective Academic Bank Account on ABC.

3. Programmes Duration and Multiple Entry and Exit Options: All programmes shall be offered as per UGC list of 'Specification of Degree' prevailing from time to time. The programme duration and options for multiple entry exit will be as per template below.

- 2. *Students shall opt for one course from other programmes (MTTM/PGDHEM) as General Elective @ 4 credits. Further, the subject to class timings should not be overlapping.
- 3. All the field work, Internship, dissertation/thesis will be effected through guided learning by allotting a teacher as guide to every student. Workload of above shall be computed per student as per Credit hours of above defined in ordinance.
- 4, Each candidate shall be examined in the courses through a system of Comprehensive Continuous Assessment using a mix of Internal and End term evaluation. The Internal Assessment and End term evaluation for different courses of programme shall carry weightage of 50% each. Internal assessment (50%) shall be based on clearly defined components of class attendance and participation (10%), mid-term exam of 2 hour duration (30%) and assignments-presentations (10%) of the credit and the rest (50 %) through End term Examination.

4. Eligibility for Admission

- A student who has passed Bachelor's Degree in any discipline from this University or equivalent degree recognised by the Kurukshetra University shall be eligible to join the First Semester of the Programme.
- The Department can offer any Course of PGDHEM as a Short-Term Value-Added 4.2 Course. The seats, mode of admission and fees for the same shall be separately decided by the department.

5. Assessment & Evaluation

- Every candidate shall be examined in the courses as laid down in the Scheme of 5.1 Examination and Syllabus prescribed by the Academic Council from time to time through a system of Comprehensive Continuous Assessment (CCA) using a mix of Internal and External evaluation. The Internal and External Assessment for different courses of the programme shall carry a weightage of 50 % each except for the courses where a different weightage is specifically provided in the syllabus.
- 5.1.1 Internal assessment shall have 50% weightage based on the following clearly defined components:
- (i) Class Participation 10%
- (ii) Mid-term exam 25 % (of Two Hours Duration)
- (iii) Assignments-presentations 15 %
- 5.1.2 External assessment i.e., remaining 50 % of total assessment will be based on End Term Semester Examinations of 3 hours duration for each course.
- 5.1.3 Class participation, mid-term exam, assignments and end term exams will have a mix of theory and practical as per the course requirements as specified in the scheme of examination and syllabus.

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- 5.2 The pass percent will be 40 % marks in each course (Theory and Practical separately), field survey, training and project report (s). The aggregate of Internal and External examinations will be used to compute per cent.
- 5.3 The Chairperson of the department shall ensure the uploading of Internal Assessment marks on the examination portal as notified by the Controller of Examinations at least one week before the commencement of the End term Semester Examinations.
- 5.4 The marks obtained by a candidate for the Internal Assessment/Field Survey/Training Reports/Dissertation shall be carried forward if s(he) is permitted to re-appear for the purpose of passing the examination.
- 5.5 The Chairperson of the Department shall preserve the record on the basis of which the Internal Assessment awards have been prepared, for inspection, if needed by the University, up to six months from the date of declaration of Semester Examination results.

6. Eligibility for Examinations

- 6.1 The First/Second Semester Examination shall be open to a regular student who:
 - (a) has passed the requisite qualifying examination as laid down in Clause 4.1 above, if s/he is a candidate for the First Semester Examination or has passed the preceding Semester Examination if s/he is a candidate for the Second Semester Examination respectively. This is, however, subject to Clauses 7 & 8;
 - (b) has been on the rolls of the Department of Tourism and Hotel Management during both semesters preceding the Examination.
 - (c) has attended not less than 75% of lectures in each course. This requirement shall be fulfilled separately, for each course. The lectures are to be counted as per notified teaching schedule that can extend up to the day before the commencement of examinations. A deficiency of up to 10% in each paper may be condoned by the Chairperson of the Department on sufficient grounds.
 - (d) has obtained pass marks in the Internal Assessment of the course(s) of the relevant Semester.

Note: A candidate who has not attended the requisite percentage of lectures or has not obtained pass marks in the Internal Assessment for any course(s) will not be eligible to take the examination in the concerned course (s) only.

6.2 The examinations for the odd semester i. e. First semester shall ordinarily be held in the month of December and for the even semester i. e. Second Semester in May/June, on such dates as may be notified by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.

The last date(s) by which the examination forms shall be uploaded on the examination portal shall be as per the schedule notified by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.

7. Duration for Passing the Programme and Rules for Reappear

- A candidate can complete the programme within the time period stipulated in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) for accumulation and redumption of credits from time to time.
- A candidate who has completed the prescribed course(s) of a programme in the department for any Semester but does not appear in the examination, or, having appeared fails, 7.2 may be allowed on the recommendation of the Chairperson of the Department to appear/ reappear in the Semester Examinations/course(s) as the case may be, at the next regular examination for that Semester when such examination(s) are held, without attending the course(s) again.

8. Conditions for promotion to Higher Semester

A candidate will be allowed to join Second Semester only if he/she clears a minimum of 50% Theory papers of the First Semester examination. . However, such a candidate may pursue his/her studies for the next higher Semester(s) and appear in the examination(s) for the same along with the examination for the lower Semester(s).

If a candidate fails to pass any Semester Examination even in the second chance as mentioned above, his pass credits will be accumulated on the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) and he can pass the remaining exams any time within 7 years or as stipulated in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) from time to time.

A candidate, whose result is declared late for no fault of his, maybe permitted provisionally to attend classes of the next higher Semester at his own risk and responsibility, subject to his passing the concerned Semester Examination. In such a case, the lectures will be counted from the date a candidate starts attending classes. In case a candidate fails to pass the concerned Semester Examination his/her attendance/Internal Assessment in the next higher Semester in which he/she was allowed to attend classes provisionally shall stand cancelled.

9. Eligibility for Degree

A candidate must pass all the two Semester Examinations of the PGDHEM programme. However, the candidate can reappear till the permissible period of accumulation of credits on the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) failing which s(he) will be deemed to be unfit for the PGDHEM programme.

However, a candidate will be allowed to attend regular classes and stay on the campus only for the total duration of a programme.

- A candidate, who discontinues his/her studies at any point of time may be permitted to 9.2. join the remaining studies and complete balance credits as per Clause 8.1.
- 9.3 The candidate(s) for the PGDHEM programme shall be required to undertake a Field Project on the dates approved by the Chairperson of the Department during the First Semester. The students may carry out project individually. They shall be required to submit a comprehensive report (hard copy and soft copy in PDF) on the events visited before the commencement of the First Semester examination. The evaluation of the Field project shall be done by a panel of two Examiners (Internal) on the basis of the report and Viva-Voce based on the Evaluation rubrics in Annexure 1. The report and viva voce shall carry equal weightage.
- 9.4. The candidate(s) for PGDHEM programme shall be required to undergo ten weeks of Internship after the Second Semester Examination in Hospitality, Events / related Enterprise approved by the Chairperson of the Department. They shall be required to submit one copy (hard copy and soft copy in PDF) of the training report in the Department after the second semester within 30 days after the competition of training. The evaluation of the Internship shall be done jointly by a panel of two Examiners (External & Internal) on the basis of the report and Viva-Voce based on the Evaluation rubrics in Annexure 1. The report and viva voce shall carry equal weightage.
- A student can opt for online courses up to 40 % as per university guidelines prevailing from time to time from Swayam and other online platforms. The credits for these courses will be added for the completion of the post graduate diploma.
- The medium of instruction and examination shall be English. 9.6

10. Examinations and Result

- The question papers shall be set and the answer books shall be examined by the 10.1 External/Internal paper-setter (s) as the case may be.
- The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each Semester shall be as 10.2 prescribed by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
- The Controller of Examinations shall publish a list of candidates who have passed the Semester Examination at an early date.
- Unless otherwise provided in the Ordinance for relevant examination, the minimum Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) required for the continuation of registration and the award of the degree is 4.00.

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10.4.1 Award of grades and the corresponding grade points should be based on Absolute marks as under. The conversion factor for conversion from SGPA/CGPA to a percentage of marks shall be 10.

- Note: (1) A candidate eligible to take the examination obtaining Grade F or Ab will be considered to have failed in the examination/course(s). Such a candidate will be required to re-appear in that examination/course(s) within the permissible chances given in the concerned Ordinance for obtaining a pass grade.
 - (2) A candidate who has not obtained pass marks in Internal Assessment, will also be awarded Grade 'F'. Such a candidate will have to appear again in Mid Term Examination/Assignments-presentations and obtain pass marks in Internal Assessment.
 - (3) If 'F'/'Ab' Grade is awarded to a candidate in a field project/training report, he/she will get only one more chance to repeat the field project work/training report. However, if a candidate still gets 'F'/'Ab' Grade in a field project/training report, the same will not be eligible for the award of a post graduate diploma.
 - (4) For non-credit courses 'Satisfactory' or 'Unsatisfactory' shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of SGPA/CGPA.

11. Student Progression and Mentoring

The students will be assessed through a system of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) by the teachers of the department using templates of evaluation rubrics and Learning Outcome-based evaluation (Annexure-1) to help their progression through the programme. A complete record should be maintained by the teachers for the same. The

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confidentiality of all reports of mentoring shall be maintained by the teachers to respect the privacy of students.

12. Improvement

A candidate who has passed the PGDHEM programme is allowed to improve their result by appearing in the scheduled semester examination(s) according to the rules and syllabus prevailing at that time as an ex-student at the fees prescribed by the university from time to time. A candidate is allowed to make repeat attempts within 7 years of passing the programme or as per the time period stipulated in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) scheme for accumulation of credits from time to time if registered with ABC.

13. Pursuing One More Academic Programme with PGDHEM

A student of PGDHEM can pursue one more academic programme as per General Rules appearing in the K.U. Calendar Volume-II, 2014.

14. Others

- A successful candidate may publish original results of the Training/Project Reports, if permitted by the Chairperson of the Department/Guide as a paper, in a Journal of repute.
- The Ordinance in force at the time a student joins the course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all the students whether old or new.
