Now the NEP Core Committee of the University after many sittings for several weeks has finalized the Ordinances for Under-Graduate Programme (Multidisciplinary), Scheme-A; Under-Graduate Programme (Single Major), Scheme-B; Under-Graduate Programme (Single Major), Scheme-C and Under-Graduate Programme (Inter-disciplinary), Scheme-D which is to be implemented for UG Programmes under NEP on campus and for affiliated Colleges w.e.f. the Session 2023-24 and the same is placed for kind consideration and approval of the Academic Council.
